Confirmations at La Victoria!!!!

We are so excited to have confirmed our first group of youth in La Victoria!!!! These four girls have been my catechism students for the last year and I am so proud of all that they have learned and come to understand in that time. They have grown in the faith and show a depth which I pray we all receive. They will be the pillars of this congregation for years to come. It is our hope to start the next group of confirmation student soon so that this may continue. The girls awaited their confirma-

Personal update: During October, we consulted with a neurologist for treatment for seizures which my husband, Jeancarlos, has been suffering. We learned that the seizures are the result of an arteriovenous malformation (AVM) a specific type of brain aneurysm. The AVM must be operated on to reduce the neurological symptoms and to reduce the risk of cranial bleeding. We have been very blessed to find a specialist here in Lima, and at the end of November the doctor will perform and embolization of the aneurysm. This will stop the blood flow to the AVM and hopefully shrink its size so that the doctor can better treat it. The full treatment plan may take up to three years. We are so thankful for all the care and help which we have received from the Office of International Mis-



sion and our church family. Thank you to all of you have already been praying. The insurance has agreed to cover the costs of the operation and LCMS is wired money to pay for the upfront fees until the reimbursements come through from the insurance. My parents are flying down to be with us for the operation as will Jeancarlos' family. We feel so blessed to have so much love and help during this difficult time. The Lord truly provides for us and ensures that all our needs are seen to.
