Course Overview:

This course will emphasize the principles of marketing, profit maximizing, business management, personal finance, investing, stocks, computer utilization and record keeping. Students will apply agricultural and personal business concepts using word processing, spreadsheets, graphics, databases, presentation and publishing software.

Course Goals:

- 6. Demonstrate knowledge in applications/ scholarships and college preparation
- 7. Exhibit knowledge in agriculture sales
- 8. Identify financing skills and demonstrate finance management
- 9. Demonstrate an understanding of the Stock Market
- 10. Demonstrate an understanding of economics
- 11. Identify and understand the process of different agriculture commodities
- 12. Develop personal skills and communication ability
