

high he expected, the drugs

he took killed him.

I know I am not the only one who has lost a son or daughter or grandchild to this disease, but it feels like it when it happens. It became personal. I'm the pastor, the one who comforts others. This time others were comforting me, and

for that I am extremely grateful. Thank you for all of you who held me on Wednesday night while I cried and rambled on. Thank you to those who prayed for Joe and our family. Thank you for the cards and condolences. Thank you for being my family at Community Presbyterian Church. God held me and Paul, our family in the palm of his hands through you. Thank you from the bottom of my heart.

Life does go on. God continues to walk with us through our grief and through the routine of life. We are back into living and looking ahead for what's to come during the seasons of our church year. Ordinary time runs through the end of November. Advent begins on December 2 this year; the Christmas season begins on the 25th of December and ends on the 6th of January.

While there are all kinds of commercial attempts to entice you into the Christmas Spirit, Community Presbyterian Church is preparing a special Advent Devotional just for you. 

This does not include the mortgage payment of \$3,146.54. There are funds in the building fund account to cover the mortgage payment through December. So far we have received \$6,243.00 toward the \$15,000.00 pledge for the building fund account.

Per capita amount for 2018 is \$44.00 for each confirmed member. The unpaid balance at the end of the year is paid out of the church general fund. Please mark on your check or envelope funds you are contributing to Per Capita.
