

a Message from Brian

My friends and Club Members,

I have a lot of news to share with you as I am certain that many of my friends have heard the rumors already.

As many know, I taught my last three class at UT Austin the last week in August. However, I was not invited to teach in the Fall. Big changes are underway with the consolidation of Continuing Education and Informal Classes, along with the extended campus certification group. It is said that classes falling into the Arts will be limited in the future. So, it is my understanding that 70% of classes have been dropped.

But as one door closes, another opens. . .

I returned September 1 from Texas A&M University-Kingsville and a meeting with the Dean of the School of Animal, Rangeland and Wildlife Sciences, The Chair of the department of Wildlife Sciences, the Director of Caesar Kleburg Wildlife Research Institute, and others, including the Kleburgs- owners of the King Ranch.

So, my meeting was to present the vision, plans and curricula for the program. It was met with very positive reactions and I was asked to get it started. As a result, I have been charged with the exciting process of developing and leading a long-term academic program of Biological and Wildlife Photography. The goal is to make it a Major, and/or Minor program, ultimately offering Bachelor-, Masters-, and Doctorate-level degrees in Biology with a specialty in Biological and Wildlife Photography. As this unfolds, it will be the only university level program of its kind. The program will reside within the Caesar Kleburg Wildlife Research Institute with TAMU-Kingsville.

This development is made possible by a sizeable donation from a charitable trust of a retired professor from Trinity University in San Antonio. The trustee was introduced to me and asked if I was interested in taking on the project. (Was "Yes" ever in question?) Little did I know at the time what a wonderful development the program will be.

This will begin as a skeleton program with limited classes, workshops and seminars this semester since the term has already started. But the plans are to get it on the calendar for the Spring Semester of 2018. As a result, I have been commuting periodically to Kingsville. My work there now includes becoming an A&M faculty member, starting and equipping my lab, building a computer teaching lab, outdoor photography blinds and learning centers. The very nice part of the program is that the donation funds included the purchase of more than \$120,000 in new camera and computer equipment and software. Getting 38 boxes from B&H was like a Giant Christmas in September.

My plans do not include moving to Kingsville, rather to hold classes on a few consecutive days per week and commute from Austin. The plans also include the initiation of online lectures as part of the curriculum. My plans also do not include leaving the Austin Shutterbug Club, although, I may be absent part of the time. I am certain that you have found that I have a very capable substitute in Stennis Shotts.

Many, many thanks to all who have helped me in my teaching efforts through the years and in making this adventure work. You have enriched my life greatly.





May 19-21 • September 28-October 1, 2017

NEW - Night Sky Workshop November 17-18, 2017

The workshop begins at 1:00 PM the first day and ends after breakfast the second.
