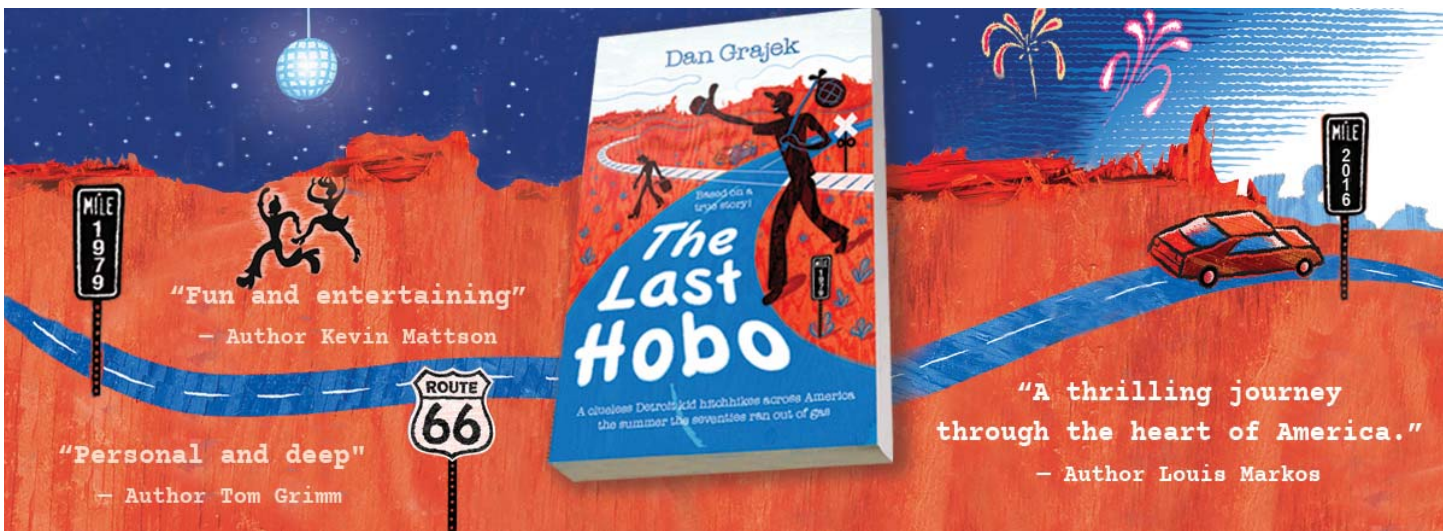

DEARBORN, MICHIGAN, May 31, 2016: In many ways, 19-year-old Dan Grajek—a college freshman—was a typical youth in the 1970s. He wanted to go on a quest to “find himself.” Suffering from an acute case of wanderlust, he desired unfettered freedom. So he and a friend set out to hitchhike from Michigan to California.

In his debut novel, *The Last Hobo*, the author not only provides a colorful, insightful, and humorous account of his adventures, but he does so from 3 angles:

- His alter-ego, Ted Ganger, wants to be a hobo, the ragged, train-hopping figure romanticized in movies.
- The year of his trip—1979—turns out to be monumental. America is engulfed in anxiety, frustration, and anger over Jimmy Carter’s unraveling presidency, the Iranian Revolution, and Three Mile Island. With a Huck Finn-like innocence, Ted witnesses the tumultuous transition from the 70s to the 80s—*on the street level*.
- Ted has a distinctly Detroit point-of-view. The hometown he often refers to, has arguably the world’s greatest success story (because of Henry Ford) and the biggest failure story (because of the city’s infamous crime rate and racial divide).
