EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

Using the Associated Press as our source, when this past weekend began we did not have a single game that matched two ranked teams playing each other. Another ho-hum weekend, right? As Lee Corso often says, "Not so fast my friend". Here are some of the results from this past weekend. Syracuse 27, #2 Clemson 24; California 37, #8 Washington State 3, LSU 27, #10 Auburn 23; Arizona State 13, #5 Washington 7; Boise State 31, #19 San Diego State 14; West Virginia 46, #24 Texas Tech 35, Memphis 30, #25 Navy 27. We also had some very close calls. #17 Michigan beat Indiana 27-20 in overtime; #11 Miami squeaked by Georgia Tech 25-24, #13 Southern California survived a scare from Utah 28-27 and #21 Michigan State had to hang on to beat Minnesota 30-27.

Every year, I hear the "experts" stating what will happen at the end of the season in mid-October and then a weekend, like this happens. It just goes to show that what we have, is a bunch of 18-22 years kids playing, so emotions (high & low) plus momentum will play a huge part, of every game. A weekend full of chaos happens every year and we shouldn't be surprised. In my opinion the odds are very high that that we will have just 1 undefeated team in the playoffs and 3 schools with 1 loss make it. Right now, I like Alabama, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Clemson to be the four schools to make it in the playoffs but Oklahoma State, Georgia, Penn State and USC are my next four.

FOOTBALL TIDBITS

Prior to their victory over #8 Washington State last Friday night, Cal had been 1-52-1 vs AP-top-10 teams since 1978.

Clemson closed as a 23% point favorite against Syracuse prior to their 27-24 loss last Friday night. It was their biggest upset loss in the last 40 seasons.

Arizona's Khalil Tate is the first FBS QB to record at least 200 rushing yards in consecutive games since Chris McCoy for Navy in 1997.

Most 50 Yard runs in a Single Season in the FBS Since 2008: 2014 Melvin Gordon 10, 2017 Bryce Love 9, 2014 Tevin Coleman 9, 2008 Jahvid Best 9.

Georgia had 696 yards of total offense vs Missouri last Saturday night, the most its had against a SEC opponent in program history.

J.T. Barrett has 3 career games with 6 Touchdowns responsible for. All other Ohio State QBs in school history have 2 such games combined.

Auburn lost to LSU despite leading 20-0 at one point in the game. Prior to that loss, AP Top-10 teams were 182-0 when leading by 20+ vs unranked opponents since 2014.

Air Force defeated UNLV after trailing 27-0 Prior to this past Saturday, FBS teams trailing by 27 points at any point in 2017 were 1-110. The other win was UCLA over Texas A&M on September 2nd.

Despite Louisville losing to Boston College, Lamar Jackson had his 2nd career game with 300 passing yards & 150 rushing yards. No other FBS QB has had such a game in the last 20 years.

After beating Tennessee 15-9 last Saturday afternoon, South Carolina has now won 6 of its last 10 games vs the Vols. From 1903-2007 South Carolina had defeated Tennessee just 3 times in 27 meetings.

The Florida State Seminoles are 20-0 vs Duke. That is their most wins without a loss vs any opponent.

Mississippi State's Nick Fitzgerald joined Dak Prescott as the only MSU players with 25 career passing TD's and 25 career rushing TD's.

Last Saturday, Michigan was the first to notch 500 wins in Big Ten Conference play. Later that night Ohio State joined them when they also notch their 500th Big Ten win.

MICHIGAN AT PENN STATE



Jim Harbaugh and his Michigan Wolverines (5-1) will travel to Happy Valley to take on James Franklin's undefeated Penn State Nittany Lions (6-0) in a nationally televised game on ABC at 7:30 PM Eastern.

This game has everything that you want in a game. It features two traditional powers, it has two programs that are in the hunt for the Big Ten East Division and this game has national implications as well.

Michigan allowed Indiana to tie their game last weekend before eventually winning in overtime. This Michigan offense is very difficult to watch at times. They have terrific running backs but opposing defenses don't respect the passing of John O'Korn, so they stack the line of scrimmage. Penn State RB Saquon Barkley is the key for the Nittany Lions. If he can rush for around 100 yards and collect another 50 yards or so catching the ball, Penn State will probably be in the game all the way to the end.

Michigan leads the all-time series vs Penn State 13-7 and leads all-time at Beaver Stadium 6-4. Michigan has won the last 3 games, including the 49-10 thrashing last year at Michigan Stadium. Due to the struggles that the Wolverines have had on offense, we're going with Penn State to come away with a close 24-20 win.



CONFERENCE CALL: THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

The Big Ten, formed in 1895, is the oldest Division I collegiate athletic conference in the United States. Big Ten member institutions are predominantly major flagship research universities with large financial endowments and strong academic reputations. Collectively, Big Ten universities educate more than 520,000 total students and have 5.7 million living alumni. Big Ten universities engage in \$9.3 billion in funded research each year. In 1990, the Big Ten universities voted to expand the conference to 11 teams and extended an invitation to Penn State, which accepted it. When Penn State joined in 1990, it was decided the conference would continue to be called the Big Ten. On June 11, 2010, the University of Nebraska applied for membership in the Big Ten and was unanimously approved as the conference's 12th school, which became effective July 1, 2011. On April 28, 2013, the Big Ten presidents and chancellors unanimously approved a football divisional realignment that went into effect when Maryland and Rutgers joined in 2014. The West Division includes Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Purdue and Wisconsin (of which all but Purdue are in the Central Time Zone), while the East Division includes Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State and Rutgers.
