CLERGY COLUMN

Merry Christmas!

What a gift this year that we have Christmas, the day of the Lord's birth, on a Sunday, the day of his Resurrection! Of course, we know that this is out of our control, but I think it's worth celebrating every time it happens. On days like today, everything good and honorable is worth celebrating. Ultimately the joy of today is the kind of joy that is meant to lead us to know that everything is going to work out for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose (Romans 8:28).

I've been thinking a lot lately about a number of things, but especially this one question: Why do our three Catholic parishes exist in these three towns? This is the answer I've come up with: We exist to tell our area that the King of the Universe has invaded our world to defeat the one who wants to ruin everything. Today we recall not only the baby born in a cave in humble circumstances, but we also rejoice in the God-Man who conquers Sin and Death by his mighty right arm. We rejoice that this Mighty Hero has turned his gaze upon us and has called us to share in his victory, in his very life. Because of this, we no longer need to live in fear of suffering and death, for our future is the kind of future that causes us to look forward with joy, facing death with a smile.

We might be tempted to think that this day, Christmas, is just one day of happiness and love, but the reality is that this day is meant to be the kind of day that flows into every day for the rest of our lives. God has come to save us! It's not possible to give an event like this just one day of celebration. It demands so much more because it changes everything. My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, I hope and pray that you know this life-changing joy, that you live in this joy every day for the rest of your lives, and that you tell everyone around you about this joy.

There are some things on the horizon that I'm very excited about, including a VERY BIG series of homilies during the seasons of Lent and Easter. I'll explain more in a letter that I'll send to parishioners in January, but I really do think this could be life-changing for many people in our towns and maybe even beyond. Ash Wednesday is February 22nd, so that will be the beginning of this nearly 100-day focus for our parishes.

One regularly-scheduled thing that I think is worth your time is an online Bible Study that I produce each week, taking some time to read through and study the readings for Sunday Mass. The studies are released each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday and can be found at youtube.com/ @fatherbryankujawa. It's so good and important for us to study the Word of God and prepare ourselves for Sunday Mass. The hope for these studies is that the Mass readings come alive for you in a new way and help you to encounter Jesus in the Word and in the Sacrament each week, whether you come to Mass at our parishes or in another Catholic parish.
