### Elisha Helps a Widow and Her Sons

2 Kings 4:1-7



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

### **Elisha the Prophet**

Elisha was a prophet who ministered in Israel during the time of the divided kingdoms of Israel and Judah. Elisha's ministry spanned the reigns of four kings: Joram, Jehu, Jehoahaz, and Jehoash. And he was even consulted by Jehoshaphat, a king of Judah.

In 2 Kings 4:1-7, it is interesting to note that the husband who died had been from "the company of the prophets." During this time in Israel in which few people followed God, groups of people gathered to promote the worship of God, with older prophets acting as spiritual mentors to younger ones. Thus it is quite possible that Elisha was familiar with the widow and her sons.

### It Seems Cruel, But...

Apparently the man who died had left significant debt. Though it seems cruel, Mosaic law provided that a creditor could force debtors or the children of debtors into slavery in exchange for unpaid debt. And even though the widow had just lost her husband, a creditor was apparently threatening to take her two sons.

The oil the woman possessed wasn't even enough to cook with. The Hebrew word for *oil* used here indicates that she had only a small flask of oil that was used for anointing, not cooking.

#### **God's Creative Plan**

God didn't respond to the widow's need by having Elisha produce a bag of gold coins that would enable her to pay her debt. Instead, knowing that they had only a tiny bit of oil, Elisha asked her and her sons to gather jars from their neighbors to fill with oil. In this way, Elisha made the widow act on her faith in God.

It would have been easy for the widow to refuse Elisha's instructions, fearing that the neighbors would think her crazy for asking for jars when they knew she didn't have anything to fill them with. But she was faithful in following the instructions that came from God through Elisha. And her faithfulness was rewarded!

### The Jesus Connection

Jesus showed even more care and compassion for needy people than Elisha did. And as followers of Jesus, we can model the same care.

Having needs can lead us to greater dependence on God. How has God helped you with needs already? What needs do you need to commit to him now? Ask God for help to depend on him with your needs. You can write your prayer here.

#### What You'll Do

Set a baby 6 months or older on your lap, and show the child the "Elisha and the Widow" teaching picture.

Say: The woman didn't have any food for herself and her boys. They were poor and hungry. God sent a special person named Elisha to help the woman get food for her family. Place some O-shaped cereal pieces in your hand. Attempt to feed one piece of cereal to the baby. If the baby enjoys the cereal, you may feed him or her more, one piece at a time. (Check with parents before feeding their child.)

Then the woman sold the oil and bought food, and everyone ate. They were so happy. Give each child a graham cracker to eat. God took care of the woman and her sons and made sure they had enough food to eat.

Say: Let's listen to a song to celebrate that ▶ GOD CARES FOR US. The woman in the Bible poured the oil God gave her into jars kind of like our pots and pans. Let's bang on pots and pans while we listen!

Give each child a pot or pan and a kitchen utensil. Play "He Cares for You" (1 Peter 5:7) (track 2 on the CD). Encourage toddlers bang on their pots and pans while the music plays.

Say: The woman didn't have food for her sons and herself. All she had was a little oil. Pass a small bottle of vegetable oil around the circle. The woman did not know what to do. God sent a special man named Elisha to help her. Elisha told the woman to pour her oil into many jars. Help the children take turns pouring a little oil into a few pots and pans. Let the children touch the oil to see how it feels. Provide wet wipes for children to clean their fingers.

Say: A special thing happened. The woman had only a little oil. But as she poured the oil, it turned into a lot of oil and filled all of the pots and pans the woman could

### Joyous Jars

#### What You'll Do

Place the tissue paper on a table or craft area. Pour glue into plastic dishes or on lids. Help kids put on paint shirts or smocks. If you don't have those, keep wet wipes handy to wipe off any messes.

Say: The woman in the Bible had a jar of oil. God turned a little bit of oil into a whole lot! Let's make our own oil jars to remind us that ▶ GOD CARES FOR US.

Show children how to smear glue onto the plastic cups and then cover the cups with the colored tissue paper. Set aside the "jars" to dry, and help kids wash their hands.

### To Market, to Market

#### What You'll Do

Arrange towels on the floor to protect it, or take this activity outside. Set a plastic container filled with water on one side of the room and an empty plastic container about 10 feet away.

Have the children line up behind the container filled with water, and give each child a plastic cup.

Say: After God turned the woman's little bit of oil into a lot of oil, the woman took the oil to sell it. Let's pretend that this water is oil. Let's help the woman take her oil to the store so she can sell it and buy food.

Have one child fill a cup with water, walk to the other container, pour the water into it, and say ▶ GOD CARES FOR US. When the first child returns, have another child repeat the process, and so on. Ensure each child has a turn.

Say: You did it! Now the woman can buy food for her family. ► GOD CARES FOR US. Hooray!

#### Nice Serve!

One of the most powerful memories you can give your child is doing a service project as a family. Develop traditions of caring for people in need. Take your child with you to visit a person who's housebound. Make an annual tradition of helping your child choose food to donate. #### 2-YEAR-OLD

#### Joyous Jars

Cut colored tissue paper or construction paper into 1-inch squares. Draw a simple jar shape on paper, and set out a glue stick or bottle of washable glue.

Say: The woman had a jar of oil. God turned a little bit of oil into a whole lot! Let's make our own oil jar to remind us that God cares for us.

Help your child glue the paper pieces onto the jar shape. Set aside the "jar" to dry.



#### Help your child become a FaithWeaver with these ideas:

- Have your child help care for a pet or a household plant. Say a brief prayer of thanks to God for caring for us.
- Together, choose toys to donate to a charity or friend in need. Talk about how because God cares for us, we can care for others.

### God Heals Naaman's Leprosy

2 Kings 5:1-16



### Victory for the Enemy?

As this passage begins, it's easy to be confused by the statement that the Lord gave victory to a commander in the army of Aram. However, it's unlikely that these victories were over Israel. Instead, they were likely victories of Syria (Aram) over the Assyrians who were threatening them. No doubt Naaman didn't recognize God's assistance at the time, but the writer of Kings did.

### **Young Girl Offered Advice**

At this time a peace treaty between Israel and Aram was in effect, but part of the border was in dispute. It was likely during one of these border skirmishes that the young Israelite girl was taken captive and became a servant in Naaman's household. This girl was aware of the miracles Elisha had performed, and she had faith that he could work a miracle in Naaman's life as well.

It's interesting that a slave girl from Israel was aware that God was working through Elisha, but that the king of Israel didn't think of Elisha when Naaman came to him for healing. The king of Israel saw only a deception designed to provoke a war between the two countries.

### Naaman Struggled With His Pride

When Naaman left for Israel to see Elisha, he took about 750 pounds of silver and 150 pounds of gold. At current prices, that would equal over \$200,000 in silver and nearly \$3 million in gold! Naaman was prepared to pay well for his healing!

Even though Naaman was willing to pay so much money to be healed, initially he was unwilling to follow Elisha's instructions to rinse himself in the Jordan River. Naaman may have hoped for an instant, easy cure, but God apparently wanted Naaman to learn something from the experience. The Jordan was no doubt muddy, and God may have used this method to reveal Naaman's pride and test his faith. When Naaman's servants finally convinced him to humble himself and do as the prophet said, God healed him.

### The Jesus Connection

Jesus set the prime example of humility, giving up his place in heaven and taking his place on earth as a relatively poor Jewish man.

What prideful things are you holding onto? Which of God's commands feels too "beneath you"? Ask God to humble you and help you follow Jesus' example, giving up anything you feel entitled to. You can write your prayer here.

Slide the stick holding the figure of Naaman into the notch, with the leprosy side showing. Push the stick up and down slowly. Naaman went to the Jordan and dipped into the water.

When you pull the figure down for the seventh time, twist the stick so that the "clean" Naaman appears.

Say: God healed Naaman because Naaman was humble and did what God said. God will take care of us, too. ▶ GOD WANTS US TO FOLLOW HIM.





### Follow the Leader

#### What You'll Do

Gather the toddlers.

Say: Naaman was a boss in the king's army. He was a leader. He'd give orders, and people followed him.

Tell children they're going to pretend to be a leader like Naaman. Choose one child to be the first Leader. Play "Who's That Washing?" (track 3 on the CD), and have children follow the Leader around the room as the music is playing. Pause the CD, and choose a new Leader. Continue until each toddler has had a turn being the Leader.

But he obeyed God's instructions and dipped seven times in the muddy old Jordan. When he came up the seventh time, he was clean! God healed Naaman!

### What You'll Do

Open your Bible to 2 Kings 5, and lay it in front of you. Show children the words and tell them the Bible is God's special book. Ask children to participate in the following actions as you retell what happened.

Say: **Naaman was a boss in the army of the king.** (stand and salute) Men obeyed his orders, and he did mighty things! (make a muscle) One day he got sick; he had sores all over his skin. (rub your hands down your arms) He needed to find a cure so he could be well again. (put your hand to your forehead, as if searching)

A little servant girl said, "You should go and see (point off in the distance) If the prophet Elisha can heal your leprosy." (rub your hands down your arms) Now Naaman was a proud man, so when he heard the order (put your hands on your

To go dip seven times in the muddy Jordan's water, (frown) He didn't want to go, until his friends said to him, (shake your head no) "You'd quickly do a big task, why not take a little swim?" (indicate "big" and then "small" with your hands)

Insert the stick with the Naaman leprosy figure into the Jordan River pocket, and begin to dip the figure up and down inside the pocket. Continue the action play.

Two times, four times, six times, he plunged like a squirmy tadpole. (dip the figure up and down)

But when he came up the seventh time, his body was completely whole! (flip over the figure so the "clean" Naaman shows)

Naaman learned to be humble, for God was greater than he. (bow down) Right then he began to serve in the one true God's army! (march in place)

Say: Figure 5 God Wants us to follow him.

Set the "God Heals Naaman" poster on the floor, and have the children gather around it.

Say: Let's use this poster to show how God healed Naaman's leprosy. Have kids use red watercolor paint to put small dots on Naaman's body in the poster. **Naaman was** very sick; he had sores all over his body. Then God told him to dip in the Jordan River seven times and he would be healed. Let's show how Naaman was healed! Let each child use the water bottle to squirt water on the poster. The water should take off the red spots on Naaman. If some spots still remain after each child has squirted the poster, use a wet tissue to wipe off the rest. God healed Naaman's leprosy when Naaman followed God and obeyed God's command to dip in the Jordan River. GOD WANTS US TO FOLLOW HIM.

Cut several circles from paper. Write tasks on the circles, such as "Stomp your feet" or "Wiggle your fingers." Put the circles writing-side down.

Say: Naaman was a boss. He gave orders, and men obeyed him. Choose a circle and I'll read it. Then you'll obey. Have your child select a circle. Read the tasks aloud, and have your child do them.

Say: God told Naaman to dip in the muddy Jordan River. When Naaman was humble and followed God, he was healed. God wants us to follow him, too.

#### Help your child become a FaithWeaver with these ideas:

- At bath time, let your child take a washable doll into the bathtub. Remind your child how Naaman dipped seven times in the Jordan River.
- Practice counting to seven with your child. Take a walk, and look for seven trees, seven birds, or seven flowers. Remind your child that God gave us all the things you are counting.

### Jonah Learns a Lesson

Jonah 1–3

ittle ones are born into a world of rules: "No touching hot stoves!" "Stay off the stairs!" "Don't hit others!" Children learn these rules typically as they break them. As caregivers, we can present boundaries in an encouraging and grace-filled manner. Our "discipline" can be based around the goal of developing children rather than punishing them. Ensure that your expectations are realistic to the child's age. Ask whether your church has a discipline policy, and familiarize yourself with it. When you lovingly guide children toward the behavior you want to see and explain that boundaries help them, too, you'll plant the seeds for understanding why we follow God.



### Jonah Learns a Lesson

Jonah 1–3



### The Setting

Nineveh was the capital of Assyria. The Assyrians were known for their power and cruelty, and it was because of their wickedness that God commanded Jonah to preach to them (Jonah 1:2). According to classical writers, Nineveh was the largest city in the world at that time, encompassing an area about eight miles in circumference. In addition, a group of four large cities in the area was also referred to by the name *Nineveh*.

### The Conflict

Jonah's reluctance to go to Nineveh may have arisen from fear for his own safety—no one likes the bearer of bad news! Or it may be because he feared that the people of Nineveh would repent of their evil ways and that God in his compassion would forgive them. Jonah may have selfishly felt that the salvation of the Ninevites would ruin his credibility as a prophet, since he had foretold their destruction. He also may not have thought it would be fair if God saved Nineveh since his own people, the Israelites, had been punished for their sins. Whatever the reason, it's clear Jonah had no interest in God's call.

### Strange Salvation

Being swallowed by a fish would be traumatic, to say the least, but in this case the event was arranged by God to save Jonah's life. For in the belly of that fish, Jonah came to his senses and realized that he needed to obey God.

We don't know why the people of Nineveh responded so positively to Jonah's message. Perhaps God had prepared their hearts. Or maybe Jonah looked really odd after having spent three days in the digestive juices of a fish, and his journey shook them up. At any rate, God spared the Ninevites when they repented—until

about 150 years later when God exacted judgment on them for returning to their evil ways.

### The Jesus Connection

Jesus is often associated with Jonah, because he spent three days in the tomb just as Jonah spent three days in the fish. But he wasn't there for his own lack of following God—he was there for ours.

In what ways have you run from God? How can you follow him better this week? Talk with God about how you're like or unlike Jonah, and thank God for his faithful direction in your life. Ask God to help you follow him even if you don't like where he leads. You can write your prayer here.

Open the container of tuna you prepared beforehand. Have each child take a turn smelling the tuna. It must have smelled like this inside the fish. Everyone say "ugh!" Pause.

Jonah prayed and told God he would do things God's way. The fish let Jonah go, and Jonah did what God wanted. Spread the bedsheet on the floor in front of the children to be a road. Have the children walk on the road.

Jonah went the way God told him and did the job he was supposed to do. We need to listen to God, too. God knows what's best for us, so we ▶ DO WHAT GOD WANTS.





#### Fish Sticks

#### What You'll Do

# Jonah Complains About God's Compassion Jonah 3:10-4:11



#### **Not Enough Change**

From this passage, it's apparent that Jonah's experience in the belly of the great fish had changed his course of action, but it hadn't really changed his heart. Essentially he told God, "I told you so!" Jonah hadn't really wanted the Ninevites to be saved from destruction, but God saved them anyway, and that made Jonah angry.

#### **Down in the Dumps**

Jonah had preached that Nineveh would be destroyed, so he may have felt that his reputation was at stake. He would have been glad to see Nineveh destroyed. When Jonah complained to God, God rebuked him, so Jonah went out of the city to wait and see what would happen to it.

God made the vine spring up with miraculous speed in order to shade Jonah. God also provided the worm that cut through the plant and caused it to die. Jonah was devastated by its destruction because he had appreciated the shade it provided. Now for the second time since Nineveh had been saved, he expressed a desire to die.

#### **Great-Hearted God**

God put up with Jonah's bad attitude throughout this whole episode. God spared Jonah's life when he disobeyed, and continued to provide for him even after Jonah expressed his anger toward God. God saved the people of Nineveh through Jonah's preaching. But Jonah only responded that it was unfair to save Nineveh. Jonah was selfishly concerned about the vine because it shaded him, but he had no compassion for the more than 120,000 people of Nineveh who needed God. And God didn't like it. When Jonah whined about the destruction of the vine—which God had miraculously provided—and said he wanted to die, God had enough!

#### **The Point**

Was God infuriated or brokenhearted when he spoke the words recorded in Jonah 4:10-11? After all that God brought Jonah through, God sorrowfully acknowledged that Jonah still hadn't gotten the point: God loves everyone, and he wants us to love them, too.

#### The Jesus Connection

Jesus showed love to a lot of people that other Jews didn't like. He shows us what it looks like to love everyone!

Who are some people you have a hard time loving? What can you do to share God's love with those people? Ask God to help you love everyone as he does. You can write your prayer here.



We can share God's love with everyone! Have children wave their hands overhead. Now, while the music plays, let's stick hearts on our friends to spread God's love.

Isaiah 6:1-8

oliness is a difficult concept for very young children to grasp. But if you alternate between the word *good* and the word *holy*, young children will begin to understand the meaning through context. Young children can understand and embrace the idea that we praise God because he is good. ### God Calls Isaiah

Isaiah 6:1-8



#### The Setup

This passage describes God's call upon the life of Isaiah, yet it occurs in the sixth chapter of the book rather than at its beginning. From the earlier chapters, we learn that Judah's relationship with God was deplorable and that God's anger was burning against his people (Isaiah 5:25). We discover that Isaiah had a terribly difficult task ahead of him if he accepted God's call, because he would be preaching of God's displeasure and the coming destruction of Judah to a people who believed they were in line for God's blessings. These chapters also help to explain Isaiah's statement in today's passage that he lived "among a people of unclean lips."

### The Holiness

In Isaiah 6:1-4, Isaiah describes the experience of witnessing the awesome holiness of God. In this passage, he attempts to describe a heavenly experience, but he has only earthly terms at his disposal. He says that the train of God's robe filled the spacious hall of the heavenly temple; this emphasizes the splendid magnificence of God's glory. Seraphs are a kind of angel not mentioned anywhere else in the Bible. The Hebrew root word for seraph means "burn," which may be related to the seraphs' purity in serving God. Their cry of "holy, holy, holy" emphasizes God's indescribable holiness.

#### The Glory

The shaking of the doorposts and thresholds and the smoke that filled the temple also describe Isaiah's experience of God's glory and power. All of this likely reminded Isaiah's Hebrew listeners how God's voice shook the earth and terrified the people when God gave the law at Mount Sinai (Exodus 19:18-19).

#### The Forgiveness

Isaiah knew that he was unclean and unworthy, but God prepared a cleansing for him. The burning coal was a symbol of both God's wrath and his forgiveness. The live coal didn't cleanse Isaiah; God did. Once his sin was forgiven, Isaiah demonstrated his faith in God by agreeing to serve God by speaking his message.

### The Jesus Connection

Greater than a mere symbol of forgiveness like coal, God sent his Son, Jesus, to offer us forgiveness. It is through a relationship with Jesus that we have hope of one day being in God's holy presence.

How has God shown his holiness to you? How have

you responded? Ask God to show himself to you more fully. You can write your prayer here.




Holiness is a difficult concept for very young children to grasp. But if you substitute the word good for the word holy, your child can relate easier because he or she is learning to distinguish between good and bad. Young children can understand and embrace the idea that we praise God because he's good. Discuss and participate in different forms of worship with your family, and encourage even your youngest child to join in. This is how your child will learn to make worship an important part of his or her life.



- As you sit for a meal, have each person in the family praise God for something. Help your child to think of a praise, too.
- Take a walk with your child, and point out the things in nature that remind us to praise God. For example, "The flowers turn their heads up in praise" or "The birds sing their praises."
- During family times, make a praise list as well as a prayer list.

### Josiah Promises to Follow the Lord

2 Chronicles 34



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

### The Boy King

Josiah began to rule Judah when he was only 8 years old, but he probably didn't rule by himself. Although his father and grandfather, Amon and Manasseh, were evil and cruel, someone had apparently trained Josiah in the ways of the Lord. Fortunately, he chose to follow in the footsteps of his great-grandfather Hezekiah and his ancestor David by obeying the Lord. When he became king, he was advised by others who were faithful followers of God.

### Josiah's Reforms

When he was 20, Josiah demonstrated maturity and wisdom far beyond his years as he began wiping out the places in Judah—and even in the northern kingdom of Israel—that were dedicated to worshipping idols.

When he was 26, Josiah decided to repair and restore the Temple, which had been turned into a house of idolatry by his father, Manasseh. It was during this cleansing that the Book of the Law was found. This was either the book of Deuteronomy or the entire five books of the Law, lost for years under the rule of kings who worshipped idols.

## Josiah's Passion to Follow the Lord

Josiah may never have actually heard the words of the Law before this book was found. When it was read to him, he tore his clothes in grief over the sins of his people. He knew that God must have been terribly angry with the people of Judah and Israel.

Because Josiah humbled himself before God, God honored him and Judah. Josiah humbly read God's Word to the people. And before God and the people, Josiah vowed to return Judah to obedience to the Lord. God's Word revealed to Josiah the sins of his people, and it caused him to see what he needed to do to truly serve God. And what a change it made! For the rest of Josiah's life, the people of Israel "did not fail to follow the Lord."

### The Jesus Connection

John 1 describes Jesus as the Word made flesh, and he changes our lives!

Consider this: How much do you read the Bible? What's good about your Bible-reading habits, and what needs to change? No matter what you have going on today, be sure to take some time to open God's Word and listen to God's voice. Then pray that God will change you because of what you read. 





# Daniel's Friends Are Safe in the Fiery Furnace Daniel 3



### Daniel and Friends in Exile furnace die

When the people of Judah turned away from the Lord, God allowed Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, to defeat Judah. At that time, the invaders took a group of young hostages, the brightest and best Judah had to offer, back to Babylon with them. Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah were among the hostages. We know Daniel's three friends best by the names given them by the Babylonians: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.

### Daniel's Friends Refuse to Bow to Idols

Nebuchadnezzar's name meant "Nebo, protect your servant!" The statue Nebuchadnezzar built was perhaps meant to represent the god Nebo. The statue was 90 feet high, but this measurement probably included a tall pedestal, and the statue itself was probably gold-plated, not solid gold. Nevertheless, it must have been an impressive structure, standing about as high as a 10-story building.

Despite an impressive statue that demonstrated the political power of the king, and under threat of death, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were willing to trust God. If God saved them, great! But even if he didn't, they were willing to die before they'd worship Nebuchadnezzar's idol.

### Daniel's Friends Survive the Heat

The furnace the three were thrown into was likely used to fire bricks or to smelt metal. Certainly at its normal operating temperature—probably between 1,600 and 2,300 degrees Fahrenheit—survival inside such a furnace would be humanly impossible. But Nebuchadnezzar had the furnace heated seven times hotter than usual. It was so hot that the soldiers who threw Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego into the

furnace died from their proximity to it! Even so, God saved the three trusting Israelites from harm.

We don't know for sure who the fourth person in the furnace was. Certainly it was a supernatural being, either an angel or possibly Jesus himself. Either way, God was there for them, blessing them for standing strong.

#### The Jesus Connection

Jesus can relate to the challenges we face as we stand up for God because he has experienced them—and much more.

Are you facing a situation in which you're challenged to stand strong for God? Do you feel ready for the challenge? Rely on him. Pray that he'll give you the strength to keep standing even when everyone around you bows to the pressure. When we stand up for God, he will help us, protect us, and reward us. 

#### Praise Pointers

Although young children are too small to grasp the concept of being brave for God, you can begin to make conversation about God a natural part of their lives. When they know him as a fundamental part of their lives from their early childhood, they'll be more ready to stand up for him when the time comes. You can build a child's devotion to God through daily Bible talks, talking about what God does for them, and prayer.

# God Protects Daniel in the Lions' Den

Daniel 6:1-23



### **Daniel Faces Political Turmoil**

Daniel was a highly respected adviser to King Darius. Daniel did such a good job as one of three administrators that Darius decided to set him above the others—above the whole kingdom, in fact. The other administrators didn't like that idea one bit, so they sabotaged Daniel. First they tried to find evidence that would discredit him, but they could find no corruption or negligence in his record.

So the officials resorted to deceit to derail Daniel, and they decided to do it on the basis of his faithfulness to God. They knew that Daniel wouldn't give up his faith for any king. They lied to Darius when they said that the royal administrators had all agreed to the edict. They knew that Daniel wouldn't have agreed had he been told about it.

The administrators thought they'd found a way to defeat Daniel, because in Medo-Persian law, once a law was issued by the king, it couldn't be changed. This was based on the idea that the king embodied the law. If a king made a law and then retracted it, there would be a contradiction in the law, which was unthinkable.

# Darius Reluctantly Throws Daniel to the Lions

When Daniel was found praying to God, Darius was trapped. Apparently there was nothing he could do to prevent Daniel from being thrown into the lions' den, and the king was distraught. As unlikely as it seemed that Daniel could still be alive the next morning, Darius was the first one to the den to find out if God had, indeed, saved Daniel. And he had!

There was no law prohibiting Darius from punishing deceitful schemers, so he had Daniel's accusers thrown into the lions' den. They were torn apart by the hungry lions before they hit the floor! Daniel's life of

faith and his trust in God saved him from destruction and brought glory to God.

# The Jesus Connection

Jesus promised that we'd face trouble in this world—but that he had overcome it. We may be punished or ridiculed for our faith, but we know Jesus has the power to save us.

When Daniel's circumstances turned negative, he maintained a rhythm of thanksgiving and prayer. What are your hardships? What hungry lions do you face? What are you thankful for today? What do you need from God? Tell him! Ask him! You can write your prayer here.



# God Promises to Restore Israel After the Exile Jeremiah 29:4-14





# Jeremiah's Tough Career

Jeremiah's ministry outlasted five Judean kings, and he witnessed numerous political wranglings as leaders who ignored God attempted to save Judah from destruction through alliances with Egypt and Babylon. Eventually he witnessed the fall of Judah to Babylon in 587 B.C., and died in Egypt a few years later.

Jeremiah prophesied that doom would befall Judah if the people didn't return to the Lord. He was persecuted because he spoke words from the Lord that people didn't want to hear. But he was faithful to God's call in spite of his increasingly difficult circumstances.

# Letter to the Exiles

Jeremiah 29:4-14 is part of a letter to the people of Judah who'd been taken into exile in Babylon. Jeremiah instructed the exiles to settle in, work toward the good of their captors' city, and even to pray for Babylon! This was likely greeted as another unwelcome message from the unpopular prophet.

The "prophets and diviners" Jeremiah mentions were probably false prophets who had been turning Judeans away from God or lying about the amount of time in the exile. Jeremiah knew that the 70-year exile would be a time for Judeans to turn back to God in trust.

# Jeremiah's Glimmer of Hope

Jeremiah 29:10-14 offers hope, a promise of restoration. Why did the Judeans have to remain captive in Babylon for 70 years before experiencing this restoration? Perhaps it was because an entire generation had to live and die in exile because of the sins of its ancestors. Or maybe it was because 70 years equaled the number of sabbath years that the

people had disobeyed God by not letting the land rest (see 2 Chronicles 36:21).

Even as his people were dragged off to Babylon, God had marvelous plans for them—plans that included hope and a future. If the people would call upon God and seek him with all their hearts, turning from the evils of idol worship, then the Lord would restore them to their land.





# Nehemiah Seeks God's Forgiveness for Israel Nehemiah 1:1-2:9

There will be times in your class when small children need to apologize for their actions. Whether it's saying sorry for taking another child's toy or apologizing for hitting, children have ample opportunities to practice saying the words "I'm sorry." And as children learn to ask their friends for forgiveness, they'll also begin to understand what it means to turn to God and apologize when we've wronged him. Young children may not always willingly apologize, and it's important not to force them to. When children feel genuine regret for their actions, an apology naturally follows—and the outcome can be highly positive as their peers shrug and say, "That's okay. Want to play?" And undoubtedly, your kids will have as many opportunities to forgive their friends as they do to apologize. As little ones learn that their mistakes are forgivable, they'll begin to understand that God forgives us and wants us to say we're sorry when we've wronged him, too.

# Nehemiah Seeks God's Forgiveness for Israel Nehemiah 1:1-2:9



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

## Bad News Broke Nehemiah's Heart

The events described in this passage occurred 90 years after the first large group of Hebrews had returned to the land of Judah. And 70 years had passed since the Temple in Jerusalem had been rebuilt. In addition, about 12 years had passed since Ezra had begun to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem and had returned to Jerusalem with a large contingent of men, women, and children, as well as excellent funding from the king. It appeared that God was working to restore his people, just as he had promised through Jeremiah and other prophets. Thus Nehemiah was surprised to hear from his brother, Hanani, that Jerusalem still lay in ruins. And that news grieved Nehemiah greatly.

# Nehemiah Responded and Acted Wisely

Nehemiah's initial response wasn't to run to the king for help; rather, he turned to God in prayer. Nehemiah's mourning and fasting demonstrated to God and to those around him how sincerely he cared about the situation in Jerusalem. Nehemiah confessed the sins that he and his ancestors had committed against God.

Then he turned to the king. Nehemiah must have done a good job as cupbearer: Artaxerxes was king for 40 years before dying of natural causes. But even for someone in Nehemiah's trusted position, coming before the king was a scary proposition. And Nehemiah was boldly asking for two enormous favors: permission to make the trip and the king's assistance in making it. Even after having prayed for days, Nehemiah silently said a quick prayer to God before making his request.

# Nehemiah's Faith and Risk Paid Off

Nehemiah's prayer was answered abundantly. Artaxerxes gave him the time off he needed, letters assuring safe passage through lands along the way, and a guarantee of building materials. In addition, the king gave him and his entourage an escort of officers and soldiers on horses! When Nehemiah prayed and humbled himself before God, God answered.

## Nehemiah Rebuilds the Wall

## Nehemiah Rebuilds the Wall

Nehemiah 2:11-6:19



#### **Scoping Out the Opposition**

Nehemiah 2:10 hints that the task facing Nehemiah would not be easy. At least two of the leaders of people living near Jerusalem—Sanballat and Tobiah—were unhappy about Nehemiah's plans. They didn't want anyone to help the Israelites.

Nehemiah inspected the wall in secret because he wanted to keep his intentions to himself until the time was right to reveal them. He already knew about the opposition of Sanballat and Tobiah, but he didn't know if other opposition existed, even within the city of Jerusalem. After conducting an exploratory examination of the ruined wall, he gathered the Jewish officials and told them of his plan, of God's blessing, and of the king's help. And they were ready to start building!

#### A Series of Challenges

After the work began, it wasn't long before opposition arose. Sanballat, the governor of Samaria, just to the north of Jerusalem, mocked the Jews. Tobiah, probably the leader of the Ammonites just to the east of Jerusalem, stood beside Sanballat in his opposition.

The secret of the Jews' early success in rebuilding the wall is revealed in Nehemiah 4:6: "the people worked with all their heart." When the wall was about halfway rebuilt and the gaps were being closed, Sanballat and Tobiah met with other enemies of the Jews and plotted their next steps. The Jews responded by praying and posting guards. Half the men worked, as the other half—well-armed—stood guard.

From within the wall, another problem lurked: impoverished Jews in need of loans were being further extorted for more money. Nehemiah quickly rectified the situation.

The final opposition to the rebuilding came in two phases: first an attempt to draw Nehemiah out so

that he could be injured or killed, and then an attempt to deceive him into showing fear and weakness by hiding in the Temple. Both attempts failed, and the rebuilding continued.

Despite the challenges, the wall was rebuilt in only 52 days! The people had accepted Nehemiah's goal, and God helped them overcome the challenges along the way.

## The Jesus Connection

Jesus was never one to shy away from challenges. He was constantly challenged by religious authorities, and he met those challenges head-on.

What challenges are you facing? How do you need

God's help to face them? Read Nehemiah 6:9. Then pray that God will strengthen you as you combat the challenges in your life. You can write your prayer here.

### **Building the Wall**

#### What You'll Do

Gather the children, and open your Bible to Nehemiah 2. Show kids the words, and tell them the Bible is God's special book.

## Little Helpers



God helps us when we ask him to, and even helps us during times we don't know we need his help. Encourage your kids when they help others by saying things such as, "You did such a good job! God is happy when we help others. because God helps us."

#### Help your child become a FaithWeaver with these ideas:

- Remind your child to ask for God's help in everyday tasks, such as during chores. Before you do a task together, say a brief prayer together asking God to be with you as you work.
- Put up a chart with your child's name on it. Add a star each time your child completes a job. Remember to make your expectations age-appropriate and to thank God for his help after a completed chore.



## **Esther Saves Her People**

Esther 2-9



#### **Esther Becomes Queen of Persia**

Xerxes, the Persian king, wanted to replace his queen, whom he'd banished from his presence because she had disobeyed one of his commands. Esther was one of many young virgins brought into Xerxes' harem to be considered for the position. Esther didn't reveal to anyone that she was a Jew. Chosen by the king as the most attractive of all the women brought before him, Esther was made queen.

Commercial and legal affairs were conducted at the king's gate. The fact that Esther's cousin Mordecai sat at the king's gate indicates that he held a high position in Xerxes' government. In his station there, he overheard the plot to assassinate the ruler. After reporting the plot to Xerxes through Queen Esther, Mordecai definitely attained a position of favor with the king, but apparently he was given no reward at the time.

## Haman's Evil Plot

Mordecai's refusal to bow before Haman probably stemmed from his insistence on worshipping God alone. He wasn't about to let Haman, an Amalekite and a descendant of ancient enemies of the Jews, take the place of God. Haman apparently hated all Jews and loved to wield the power of his high position in Xerxes' government. When Mordecai refused to bow to him, Haman decided to wipe out all the Jews in the kingdom.

#### **Esther and God's People Fast**

When Esther realized what the king's decree meant, her response was to fast and to have all the Jews in the city fast as well. Though prayer isn't mentioned here, the intent of the fast was to seek God's favor and direction.

It may seem an easy task for Esther to stand up and tell the king of Haman's plot, but she risked her life by approaching the king uninvited. After Haman was hanged, there was still a problem: The edict to kill all the Jews couldn't be withdrawn. However, Xerxes commanded Esther and Mordecai to write a new decree allowing the Jews to defend themselves. Esther was obedient in serving God where he had placed her, and God used her actions to preserve his people.

Jesus said that he came not to be served, but to serve

(Mark 10:45). And he wants us to do the same!

### **Touching Power**



# Job Remains Faithful in Suffering

Job 1:1-2:10; 42:1-6, 10-17





#### Job Is Tested

In the book of Job, Satan came before God and claimed that Job, a righteous and extremely wealthy man, remained faithful to God only because he had been blessed by God. Satan suggested that Job would reject God if all Job had was taken from him. God allowed the test, and Job was stripped of everything: his wealth, his family, and his health. Three friends tried to comfort him but ended up criticizing and blaming him instead. All the while, Job insisted on his innocence and refused to turn against God. In the end, God spoke to Job and chastised Job as well as his three friends for the fallacies in their arguments.

### Job Asks God the Eternal Question: Why?

When Job lost his family, he didn't hesitate to express his grief. He didn't lose his faith in God, but he expressed human emotions. And his words indicated that he knew God was in charge and was worthy of praise even in the midst of suffering. Even when he lost his health, Job "did not sin in what he said" (Job 2:10). He simply questioned why God would allow such suffering to be inflicted on an innocent man.

God spoke to Job, answering Job's questions with a series of questions that underlined how little Job knew about God (Job 38–41). Job had begun to question God's righteousness and love. God silenced those doubts, but also made it clear that he owed no one an explanation for the reasons for Job's suffering.

#### **Job Believes**

Realizing that God hadn't turned against him, Job was willing to accept that God had a reason for allowing him to suffer, even though God never revealed that reason. Job was relieved to discover that God still cared about him and was with him through all he had

endured. And the restoration of Job's wealth along with the blessing of a new family demonstrated to Job that God had not abandoned him.

#### **The Jesus Connection**

In his Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5), Jesus said, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." We're blessed when we suffer because then we can experience Jesus' hope all the more clearly.

When have you suffered, and what part did hope (or a lack of hope) play in that suffering? What's an area of pain in your life right now? Ask God to use it to reveal more of himself and his hope to you. You can write your prayer here.



#### No Wonder Job Felt Better Easy Prep

Make copies of the "Glasses" pattern on heavy paper or card stock; you'll need 1 copy for each child. Cut out the frames and lenses portion of each pair of glasses. Fold back the earpieces. Gather pictures of God's creation—pictures showing God-made wonders, not manmade things. Place these in visible spots around the room.



#### No Wonder Job Felt Better

#### What You'll Do

Open your Bible to the book of Job, and show kids the words. Tell kids the Bible is God's special book. Give each child a pair of the glasses that you made.

Say: Job loved and served God. But bad things happened to Job. Job was very sad. He had no money and no family. Job even had terrible sores all over his body. Job cried. He was hurting. God came to Job and reminded Job of all the good things around him. There are pictures all around the room of things God might have shown Job. But you'll have to put on your glasses to find them. Help children put on their glasses. Encourage them to search for and collect the pictures.

Say: What wonderful things did you find? Let children describe each picture.

## Wipe It Away

#### What You'll Do

Sit on the floor with children.

Say: Job was so sad that he cried and cried. No one could wipe away his tears or make him feel better. Use a makeup concealer stick to draw tears on any children who are willing. Let them see their tears in a mirror. Now you have tears just like Job. Job had sores on his body, too. Use the concealer to draw a few "sores" on children's arms.

Say: No wonder Job was sad. Can you make sad faces like Job? Let children make sad faces in the mirror. God cared that Job was hurting. God always cares when his children hurt. He can wipe sadness away. Use wet wipes to clean away all the tears and sores. God loves us, and he cares when we're hurt and sad.

# **Changing Thoughts**

#### What You'll Do

Give each child a "Job Remembers" page and four chenille wires.

Say: Job was sad. Can you take a chenille wire and make Job a sad mouth? Guide children in making sad mouths for Job. Don't glue the mouths onto the picture yet.

Then God reminded Job of good things. Maybe Job thought about mountains! Can you make mountains? Children may bend the chenille wires into mountains and glue them into one of Job's thought bubbles. Maybe Job thought about fire! Help children create flames and glue them into another thought bubble. Maybe Job thought about the beautiful oceans! Help children create waves and glue them into the last thought bubble. Maybe Job thought of all this and smiled. Before we glue on Job's mouth, let's turn it around so that he is smiling. Guide children in reversing the sad mouth into a happy one and then gluing it onto their pictures. God came to Job to help him.

# **Growing With Jesus**



our child learned that God helps us when we're sad (from Job 1:1–2:10 and 42:1-6, 10-17). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

#### **INFANT**

#### Helpful Wipes

Sit on the floor with your baby. Hold a doll and a handkerchief.

Say: Sometimes even babies are sad. I think this poor baby doll is crying. She must be hurt. Let's wipe her tears away. Hand the handkerchief to your baby. Would you like to wipe the baby's tears? Guide your baby's hand to wipe the pretend tears from the doll's face. God helps us when we're sad, too.

#### **TODDLER**

#### He Helps Every Hurt

Sing the following to the tune of "The Hokey Pokey" with your toddler:

God made this big toe. (point to one big toe)
God made that big toe. (point to your other toe)
God made our toes, and so he's sure to know. (wiggle both toes)
Is that toe unhappy? (point to your toe)
Does it make us cry? (point to imaginary tears)
We know that God will help. (clap your hands)

Continue the song with other body parts such as hands, elbows, knees, and heads.

#### 2-YEAR-OLD

Small children experience many bumps and bruises. They bring their hurts to Mommy or Daddy for kisses and hugs. What a wonderful opportunity to teach your child that the greatest "hurt healer" is God, who is always ready to lavish heavenly kisses on us and help us when we're sad!

#### Help your child become a FaithWeaver with these ideas:

- Play with your child and a stuffed toy. Let your child comfort the animal or doll as if it were hurt. Discuss how God comforts and helps us when we are sad.
- Look for God's majesty in the things around you. When you go outside, tell your child that our mighty God made the biggest tree and flung the stars into the sky! Remind your child that this same powerful God loves us, and he is in control, even when we are sad.
