

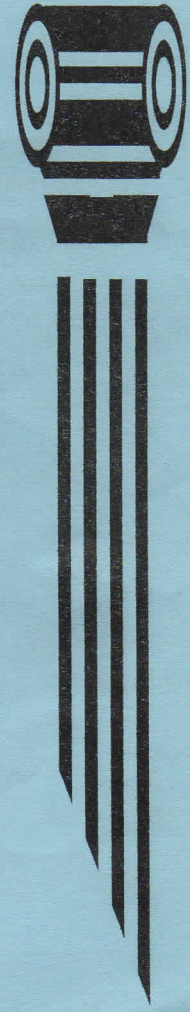
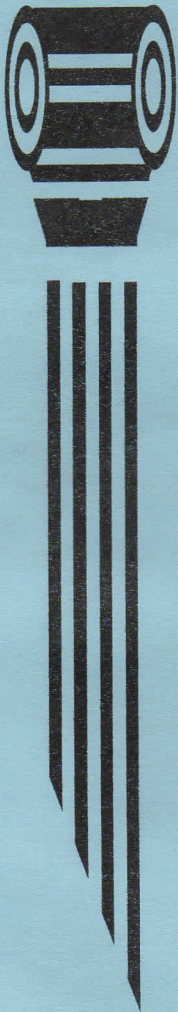

**BY LAWS OF THE
APOSTOLIC FAITH BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.**

Article VII
Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

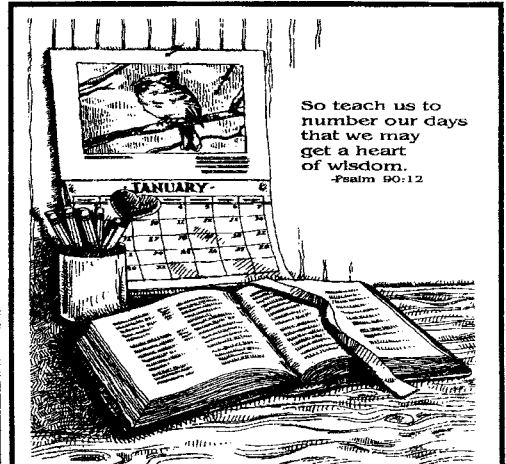

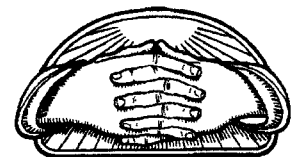

LESSONS FROM THE PASTURE

I occasionally work on a ranch about 5 miles outside of Pampa, TX. It belongs to some very dear friends of ours. It is to this ranch that I have gone many times to just get away to read and pray.

It is in one of the barns with the roof halfway off and nobody around that I have cried out to God, making my appeals, expressing my frustrations (as if he doesn't know them anyway), pled the blood, asked for forgiveness and asked for spiritual clarity.

I remember one point where I really knew God "spoke". I remember asking God to just tell me what He would say to me if he were speaking to me face to face. Suddenly it came to me-his reply - "I wouldn't tell you anything different than what I've already told you," and then so many scriptures concerning God's delivering and keeping power came to mind.

There is a golf cart that I sometime drive out into the pasture where I can hear nothing but the wind. One time I decided just to walk out there. Once again, the pasture became a sanctuary - a place where God met. Although he knows all things, the Psalmist says in Psalm 62 to pour out our hearts to him. As I walked, talked, and tried to listen, some thoughts came to my mind that weren't necessarily new-but perhaps I gained some fresh insight to replace what had become stale.

The following are simple observations that may not have any relevance to you, the reader, but to me in my journey through life, truths that I have known in my head now become "Oh I see" or "Oh I'm seeing now," realities.

One of these lessons concerns a part of the pasture that, although even from a short distance away, it looks flat but upon closer inspection, it is the bumpiest and most rutted part of the pasture. The crevices aren't deep but they are many and close together. To drive across very fast would be very jarring and to try to run across it could result in a twisted ankle or worse. The best way to get across is to take it slow. That takes patience... patient endurance of the bumps. Can't you build a sermon out of this? At times, it's not the big test or adversities that makes us stumble, but the little, closer together annoyances of life. We (I) get to going too fast, thinking I don't have time to slow down, and life gets bumpy.

Another thing about this piece of ground could be considered. It's already been mentioned that things aren't always as they seem. Sometimes someone else's piece of ground may look flat from where we are, but we may be surprised to find that it's harder walking for them than we realize. Other's lives may not be as carefree as we perceive them to be.

Someone gave my wife a poem entitled "It's in the Valley's I Grow." After I've made it through something, I can look forward and say "He brought Me Out!"

I don't have to walk in the pasture very far before the rolling hills of the Texas panhandle become evident. There are 4 or 5 valleys or ravines on the Stokes property. A couple of them have a more gradual slope than others do and walking down them is easy. The climb out is gradual also, but it's a long way to get out. In life's walk, the descent into trials, testing and sin may be gradual; barely perceptible at times and then it takes time to walk out (or climb out) of a low spot. This is not to say of course, that the Lord can't and often does deliver us at once; however I know there are still times that He expects effort on our part as He does His part.

A couple of the pasture valleys aren't as wide as the others, but they are deeper and steeper. It doesn't take so much to get down in them but requires a little more effort to get out. So it is with life. Sometimes trials may be more intense-more emotionally consuming-more faith demanding than other ones. It's easier getting into than getting out. Abram went "down into" and then "came up out of." Gen. 12:10 and 13:1. Often just looking at the climb in front of us makes us tired or we start out thinking "it's not so big" and find out our climb is laborious if we're doing it in our own strength.

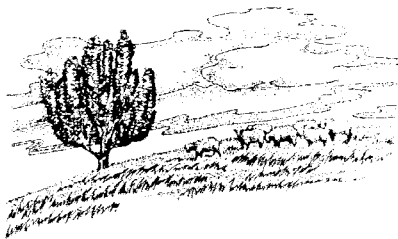
I've noticed though, even after coming out of the valley and walking on the flat land, there are

still obstacles to watch out for such as cactus, yucca plants, prairie dog holes, and ironically there are things that are called "devil's claws" (those brown things that grab hold and wrap around your shoe if you step on them right.) These may not stop your progress, but they can make you walk off balance. I need to be careful of where I step. In my Christian walk, I need to take heed lest when I've made it through a particular rough patch of living, because the devil still wants to do his best to 'get me down.'

On the back side of the pasture there is a spot where the dead animals are taken, and after the coyotes and the like get through with them and the sun does it's work, there remains the bones (which reminds me of Ezekiel 37) dear God, help me not to be a dry bone (the word dry means ashamed, confused, disappointed.)

At the ranch, the view is wonderful once I get out of the valley. From the high places, I can see for miles. The wind is blowing and I feel good. Along with the openness I see, there is something else that catches my eye. I see others valleys, some in the not so far distance. But if I'm to see the other side, I've got to just keep walking.

It's true my pace is slower sometimes (close to a crawl). *Maybe I just need to stand still.*

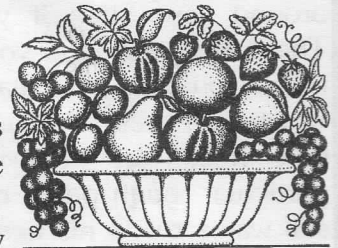
In Memory Of

William E. "Ed" Cass Jr.

On Aug. 18, 1922, Ed Cass was born at home on the family farm in Artesia, NM, the youngest of five. At the age of six, his family moved to Wink, TX where his father became a judge. He started school in Wink, which he enjoyed very much. Every day as soon as school was over he would go outside and kick his shoes off and his sister Fay had to be responsible to get the shoes home. In High School he joined the band as a drummer.

His oldest sister Holly said her fondest memory of her little brother was; On Sundays, they would dress in their best and walk to church. Ed would always lag behind. Church would start and soon Ed would come in covered in dirt, shirt untucked and barefooted. In his teenage years, he spent his summers at his aunt and uncles ranch at Carlsbad, NM catching and selling rattlesnakes for 50 cents to a tourist attraction at Carlsbad caverns. Staying out in the sun made his skin very dark and many tourists thought he was a local indian and wanted to take his picture. He didn't correct them because they paid him 25 cents each time.

After graduation from high school he wanted to get his pilot license. The day of his solo flight in Odessa, TX he was to fly up, circle the airfield and land. He flew up, circled the airfield, then flew to Dallas, landed and refueled and back to Odessa. In spite of that, he obtained his license. He also enjoyed flying as a stunt pilot. He joined the Air Corp to be a test pilot. The U.S. was at war and his goal was to make lieutenant and fly. One day he was on a test flight when the plane malfunctioned causing a crash and he spent 6 months in the hospital recovering from his injuries. He refused a medical discharge and was stationed at a desk job in FL.

In 1947 he and Alice Walker were married. To this union was born 6 children, David, Kay, Jerry, Linda, Mardi and Stephen. In 1951 Ed began work in the oil field as a rig mechanic foreman. He hired his wife's best friends husband, Marvin Boyd. Marvin and Ven attended the Apostolic Faith Church in Big Spring, TX They invited Ed and Alice to a revival in Snyder, TX. The evangelist was Ben Barker. Alice went with them that night and the next night all 4 went. The service was very good, except Ed thought the preacher was preaching directly to him. He said, "I'll never go back." The next day, Marvin saw Ed as he was leaving for work and asked if he could speak to him a moment. He sat in Ed's truck and simply said, "Jesus loves you." As Ed drove home, he struck a match to light his cigarette and the match went out. He struck another match and it too went out. He said, "Lord, if that is you, do it again." He struck the 3rd match and it went out. He pulled over and knelt at the running board on his truck and asked Jesus into his heart. He never looked back.

In 1953, Ed and Alice with 3 children in tow left TX and went to the Apostolic Faith Bible School in Baxter Springs, KS. While at school Ed dove into the lessons he was taught and his favorite subject was Prophecy taught by Gail Schultz. After the term ended, they purchased a travel trailer. Ed had a calling to work in revivals. They traveled from revival to revival helping to set up tents where needed and went door to door inviting the town's people to services.

As the time approached for the birth of their 4th child, they decided to return to West Texas. Living in Odessa, they would drive 60 miles every Sunday morning to attend the Apostolic Faith Church in Big Spring, and then drive back home.

In 1957 while working at Sears in Odessa, TX Ed asked for a transfer to Joplin, MO because he still had a desire to learn more from Gail Schultz. While living in Joplin, two more children were born. On paydays, Ed and a good friend would go to the bakery and buy 2 dozen pies and take them to the Bible School. The students would come running to their car to help carry pies.

Years had passed and Ed and Alice purchased a camera store in Lubbock, TX. Soon they purchased a 2nd store and Ed added his talents as a jeweler to his business. He met JR Church who also had a love for prophecy. Rev. Church had a vision to go to Israel and take pictures following all the accounts in the Bible. He needed a photographer that would be able to take pictures for him, He told Ed he would pay all expenses if he would go and be the photographer. His vision was to take panoramic pictures so that you could view them and feel that you were there. While there in Israel, they made contact with Zvi Hoffman who was the Minister in charge of Religious Diggings. Zvi befriended them and they struck up a friendship which lasted for years. He granted them permission to go where no Gentile had been allowed to go at that time. They were able to go underneath the Western Wall and to view the diggings that were going on. When they returned both men had copies. Ed showed his to many churches in W. TX, NM, KS, OK and MO. He presented the program to men's groups, women's groups and libraries. He never charged a fee or received an offering. This was still the calling that he had received many years before to bring revival to all people who needed a Savior.

Ed and Alice were needed in Odessa, TX. Alice's mother was ill and Ed's brother-in-law needed a caregiver, so they moved there and ran the Diamond Shop on Main St. for 5 years and Ed was still showing his program.

In 2008, Ed and Alice moved to Carthage, MO to live with their daughter and son-in-law, Kay and Wayne Wheeler. In 2010 Ed showed his program one more time at the Apostolic Faith Church in Prosperity, MO.

Ed was very proud of all his children, grand children and great - grandchildren. His desire was to show them even when he was 90 years old that Jesus was Lord.

At Ed's memorial services, his grandson-in-law, Brian Harris brought the memorial message. At the close Brian asked for those that needed a Savior to respond and one responded. Another time, Ed's ministry and influence reached a soul and we praise our Heavenly Father for His faithfulness.



Looking back at past issues of the 2012 Report I have seen the faithfulness of our Heavenly Father. We've heard of His blessings in all ministries, both at home and abroad, in churches, revivals, youth camps, Youth Summit, Camp Meeting, Bible College, Sunday Schools; the list goes on and on. Many of our friends and family in the Lord have gone through deep valleys this past year and yet you too have shared how God walked with you and did not leave you in the times when you needed Him so very much. Thank you for showing many of us how to trust and walk in those times also

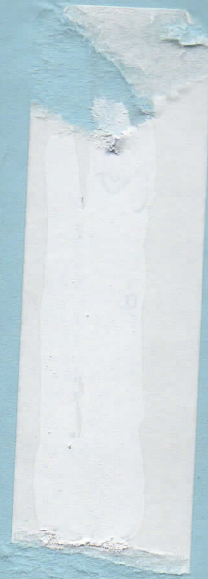
We read of the fruit produced in Godly lives bringing souls into the Kingdom of God and also were told of callings to God's work in the future.

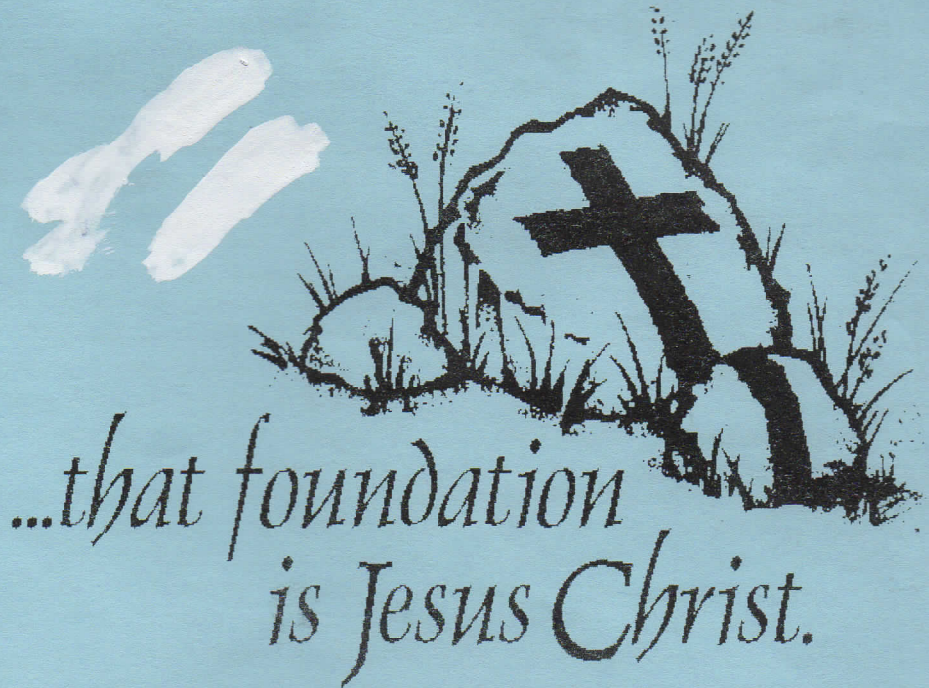
