TRUTH SPOKEN WITH LOVE!

(Ezek. 33:7-9; Ps.95: 1-2, 6-9; Rom. 13:8-10; Matt. 18:15-20)

Brothers and sisters: Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another...(because) love is the fulfillment of the law.



As we learned last Sunday, our Christian life is a life of the cross. It is a sacrificial love that we owe to our friends and foes alike.

Regrettably, in our individualistic and relativist environment, some prefer not to get involved and play the role of a *prophet* or a *disciple* in other people's affairs. There are times when we think about butting or

intervening into another person's matters, but we don't. A good friend of yours may be doing something you know is criminal, morally wrong and/or sinful but you prefer "not to get involved." It's none of my business! He or she may be a reckless driver – a threat to his safety and that of others, but you say or do absolutely nothing, because you do not want to offend him/her and ieopardize the relationship. Someone you know may be involved in a business or practice that poses a danger to the community, but you neither say nor do anything about it, because you "don't want to get involved." You play the ostrich, because of fear! Some community leaders, including priests, teachers and politicians often turn a blind eve to certain social ills because they are too afraid to confront the perpetrators. Many parents have become too friendly with their children and / or too afraid to challenge their unruly behavior. They are lax in their duties and hence neglect their responsibility to help their children make the right choices in life. They simply "do not want to get involved." If parents are honest and firm with their children, and if married couples and friends are often honest with each other through fraternal corrections, our society would be a more peaceful place to live.

In the *Confiteor*, you and I ask for God's forgiveness "...in what I have done and what I have failed to do..." We should not ignore the fact that our nonchalant attitude toward a sister or a brother, who is living in sin, is an act of sin on our own part. That is why the Lord, through Prophet Ezekiel, exhorts, "You...I have appointed watchman...If I tell the wicked, *O wicked one, you shall surely die*, and you do not speak out to dissuade the wicked from his way, the wicked shall die for his guilt, but I will hold you responsible for his death." The Lord wants you and me to know that we should be our brothers' and sisters' keeper or else we will answer for it if a brother or sister should go wrong and we knowingly refused to correct such a brother or a sister. Therefore, when next you feel like "not getting involved," remember that you will be held responsible if you refuse to offer mutual advice and admonition to the one who needs it.

Sadly, for fear of reprisal or hate, some prefer to tell a third party about the faults of a sister or a brother instead of correcting her / him directly with love. But Jesus wants you and me to be each other's keeper. He wants us to look out for the salvation of a fellow brother and sister. Thus, in today's gospel, Jesus teaches us the steps to follow when we correct or reconcile with one another. Bear in mind, your silence might often be a sin. You and I share the responsibility of preaching and practicing God's love; and doing so demands sacrifice and truth spoken with love. The Lord has entrusted each of us with the duty of acting as a *watchman* to one another. We must carry out that duty with a spirit of love, and with the intention of building the individual rather than destroying the person. We correct, not for fear of punishment, but because doing so is an act of love.
