



Cindy grew up in Long Beach, California next door to a professional seamstress who taught her at her knee. She began creating original sewing projects from early elementary school age. Cindy took Home Economics in Junior High school and learned how to sew garments. She continued to make many items for herself and her family. In 1980 she made her first applique quilt from a sewing pattern for her daughter's bed. Then many years later In 1997 she was introduced to patchwork by a friend, and later that year to the actual quilting process via books and magazines. Cindy has made well over 150 quilts to date, and enjoys designing her own original work. Her philosophy is to be a "well-rounded quilter," trying as many different techniques as possible. Her body of work includes hand, fused, and machine applique, machine piecing, and hand, domestic machine, and longarm quilting. She also enjoys hand dyeing her own fabrics.

Cindy is a devout Christian, and many of her pieces are a reflection of her faith. She likes to have a balance in her quilting time and gives many quilts to charitable organizations, friends, and family, while also creating show pieces for competition. She also enjoys presenting lectures, trunk shows, and teaching her techniques. Cindy was diagnosed with Rheumatoid Arthritis the same years she began quilting, and later Sjogren's Syndrome, and Lupus.
