




GREETING

For those waiting in the face of uncertainty: Grant unshakeable confidence in your sovereign provision.


For those waiting for justice and mercy to reign: Grant a glimpse of your glory in our wounded world.

PEACE





and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.


INVITATION TO COMMUNION
