From South Interstate 5, take exit 105 (State Capitol/City Center/Port of Olympia.)

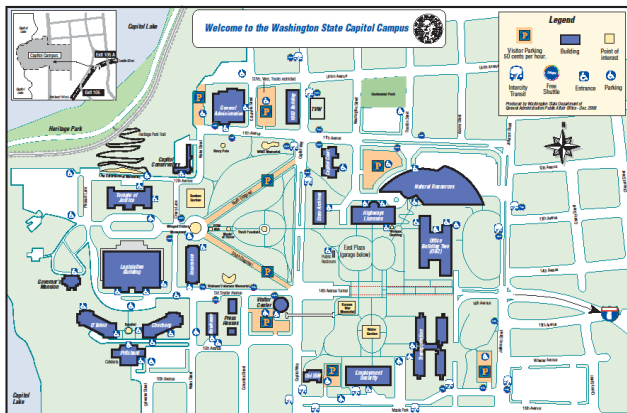
Merge onto 14th Avenue SE.
