STUDY & DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. There are a lot of evil things in this world. The Bible says the builder of all things is God (HEBREWS 3:4). Does that mean God built those evil things? Explain and defend your answer.

2. HEBREWS 3 uses the analogy of a *house* to identify God's people. With this understanding, suggest several applications that can be made today for MATTHEW 12:25.

3. Read MATTHEW 16:18 and explain why it is erroneous to interpret that to mean that the church is built on the Apostle Peter.

4. Some treat a particular physical structure as being sacred—similar to the sense of MATTHEW 21:13. What should be the Christian perspective on this?

5. HEBREWS 3:6 seems to imply that if a person does not *hold fast* to Jesus, that person can be removed from God's *house*. How can 1 JOHN 2:19 help us to rightly understand this passage?
