General Clean Up Before Easter

Clean up and clean out the following areas:

- · Pole barn storage area outside and the area where the tractor is stored.
 - · Sunday School storage unit
 - · Clean up and clean out preschool shed
 - · General cleaning in the kitchen
 - · Picking up debris on playground and around the church grounds

Power wash the exterior of the education buildings

Note: Come when you can and stay as long as you are able. "Many Hands Make For Light Work".

We will need some trucks to take the trash/junk across the street to the transfer station.

Future projects:

- · Both doors to the pastor's office need work. The inside door, frame and trim needs to be replaced. The outside door and adjacent wall needs to be rebuilt in order to make it weather tight and secure. New Doors are on order.
- · We need to address repairs to our parking lot. Both entrances need to be repaved and several areas are breaking up. We also need to seal coat some areas and stripe the parking spaces. This has a price tag of about \$25,000, which we may have to address in phases. If we don't address these areas soon, the water will get to the underside of the pavement causing potholes. This will increase the cost of repairs.


