The USPS Boat School will be held in conjunction with the District 16 Rendezvous on June 23rd and 24th. Coastal Navigator and Advanced Coastal Navigator certifications will be available. Certifier and Certifier Trainer training will also be offered.

Coastal Navigator certification will be offered on June 23rd and 24th. Advanced Coastal Navigator will be offered on June 23rd. Certifier and Certifier Trainer training will be offered both days. Inland Navigator Certifier training will be available.

The Boating Skills Virtual Trainer (boating simulator) will be available for trainees and certification candidates to brush up on existing skills and the new ANSI skills. The trainer will be available for all District 16 Rendezvous attendees to test their boating skills as well as learn new skills. The simulator will be available June 23rd, 24th and 25th in the dock classroom.

Registration for Coastal Navigator certification and Advanced Coastal Navigator certification is due by June 8th. Materials will be sent to registrants June 9th. Certifier and Certifier Trainer candidates should register by June 8th. A Passport will be needed for the Coastal Navigator and Advanced Coastal Navigator candidates.





## **Vessel Safety**



Point Wilson Sail and Power Squadron offers Vessel Safety Checks, which is a Free Check of a vessel's equipment for compliance with Federal and State Safety Requirements. When your boat passes the inspection, you will receive a decal like the one to the left.

You may also want to complete the Virtual Vessel Safety Examination at http://vdept.cgaux.org/vve/launch.htm.

The Vessel Examiners performing this service have been trained to look for some of the common problems which might occur in your boat or its associated safety equipment.

- 6 May The moon is at **perigee**, 56.1 Earth-radii (358,000 kilometers) away. With perigee occurring 15 hours before the new moon, expect tidal extremes.
- 9 May Mercury is at inferior conjunction as it passes between the sun and Earth.
- 10 May The **Gemini Twins**, **Pollux** and **Castor**, are 1 fist-width to the moon's upper right low in the west tonight.
- 11 May Tonight, the **Gemini Twins** are 1 fist-width to the moon's right, and bright **Procyon** is 1 fist-width below the moon.
- High in the south at dusk, **Regulus**, in the constellation **Leo**, the Lion, is 2 finger-widths above the moon. **Jupiter** is 1½ fistwidths to the moon's upper left.
- 14 May Tonight, the moon is less than 2 finger-widths from **Jupiter. Regulus** is 1 fist-width to the moon's right.
- Regulus, Jupiter, the moon and Spica line up from upper right to lower left in the south this evening. Jupiter is 1 fist-width to the moon's upper right, and Spica is 3 fist-widths to the moon's lower left.
- 16 May The moon is midway between **Spica** and **Jupiter** tonight.
- 17 May **Spica** is less than 4 finger-widths to the moon's lower left this evening.
- 18 May The moon passes 3 finger-widths to **Spica's** left tonight. The moon is at **perigee**, 63.64 Earth-radii (406,000 kilometers) away.
- 19 May Low in the southeast at dusk, **Spica** is 1½ fist-widths to the moon's upper right, and **Mars** is 2 fist-widths to the moon's lower left
- 21 May The full moon and **Mars** rise together, and by midnight, Mars is 3 finger-widths to the moon's lower right. **Antares**, the heart of **Scorpius**, is 1 fist-width below the moon. **Saturn** is 4 finger-widths to the moon's lower left.
- 22 May The moon, **Saturn** and **Antares** rise less than an hour after sunset. At **opposition**, **Mars** is on the opposite side of our sky from the sun. When it makes its closest approach to Earth in a few days, the red planet's face will be fully illuminated, at its brightest for the year and visible all night long.
- 23 May Low in the west before dawn, **Saturn** is 3 finger-widths to the moon's lower right, and **Mars** is more than 1 fist-width beyond Saturn.
- 24 May The moon is above the dome of **Sagittarius** this morning.
- 29 May Rising 4 hours before the sun, the last-quarter moon is high in the south at first light.
- 30 May Mars is closest to Earth, only 0.503 astronomical units away. At magnitude –2.0, it's near its –2.9 maximum brightness.

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
