DESCRIPTION: This is a very attractive bow. Pearson made very few 1962+/- Mustangs with this wood riser combination. Looks more like a Palomino. A tip was broken off one end, so this bow was modified. It was shortened and new tip overlays added. It is now a semi-recurve and is price accordingly. Bow has no delamination; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. 2 barely visible filled screw holes in the overlay on the face of the riser. (see left pic on last page). No chips or dings. No crazing or stress lines. Typical yellowing of the limbs, which have been re-stained. (Note: the limbs are a uniform color, but look a bit different in the pics due to camera lighting). A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decal is a reproduction. The biggest flaw is a repaired 4" narrow superficial scrape of the fiberglass near the edge of the lower left face limb from the decal on down (see right pic on p. 5). This is more visible when the bow is strung. I have shot this bow several different days to test it, and it seems fine. The bow still shoots really well.

Comes with a new string.

NOTE: Because of the modifications, this bow begins to seriously stack at 28", so it is recommended for an archer with a draw length less that 28 inches.
