

What a challenging winter, in so many ways. I always imagined living away from the city, in a wooded area, in communion with nature. As my father used to say "Be careful what you wish for."

My husband Oran and I have spent this winter in country solitude. Every day 7 large turkeys come to eat from our birdfeeders and have now trained us to put out some corn for them. I have truly enjoyed the winter wildlife yet country living has its own challenges.

February 12th my laptop used for everything St. Mark's needs began to crash. I attempted to back things up to save them. The next day I packed up the computer and headed into Polo to drop it off with Kent from church and see if he could save it or anything on it.

That Saturday was about -12 degrees in temperature without wind chill. There was blowing and drifting on the road. As I entered our country driveway my left tire slipped on the ice and snow and the car was ditched. I called for a tow truck to pull the car out. Half an hour later he called to say the tow truck broke down in the cold. He would go back to the garage and work on it.

Kent called to declare the computer was indeed no longer useable. Tow truck man tried a second time but the tow truck still didn't like the cold and we would need to wait until Sunday morning, I didn't mind waiting but it was -16 degrees temperature without the wind chill and there was a lot of wind chill.

There has been a lot of waiting. Waiting for the tow truck. Waiting for the roads to be safe. Waiting for snow and ice to stop. Waiting for the new computer to arrive. Waiting to install things into the new computer. Waiting for the driveway to thaw. Waiting for the vaccines to arrive. Waiting for springtime.

We all look forward to worship in church as usual and yet we wait. Church is coming back just as springtime is coming. Before we know it the waiting will be over. In this season of Lent we know that the Resurrection is coming.

Council Highlights from the February Church Council Meeting

Correspondence: Pastor received a thank you note from Bill Hare regarding the recent \$525 donated from St. Mark's Lutheran Church members toward the Honduras Project.

Treasurer's Report: Income for the month of January was \$5,890 with expenses \$10,417 with a deficit balance of \$4,527 for the month. The church received approval from the SBA (Small Business Administration) for a second Payroll Protection Program (PPP) for the amount of \$12,317. Special thank you to Renee Boyle and Lori Christen for completing the PPP documentation/application, completion of annual wage statements, and other financial needs. An audit of the church's financial records for 2020 calendar year was conducted by First State Bank Shannon,-Polo-Lake Carroll. In addition, the new check signers completed their bank processes.

Pastor's Report and Worship Plans: Pastor has sent Valentine's Day cards to care facility members and confirmation students. Additionally, conducted phone prayers for families suffering from Covid. An indoor worship service was held February 7th with 15 people signed up and 10 in attendance. People were very compliant and seemed to appreciate the opportunity. Discussion ensued regarding future plans for in person worship. In person worship will resume March 7th and 21st at 10:30 a.m. Council approved to hold in person Good Friday services at 6 p.m. and Easter services at 8:30 a.m. & 10:30 a.m. Reservations requested, but not required. Lenten services will be provided online.

Hospitality: The team has been making intermittent wellness calls.

Polo Council of Churches: The meeting was held January 25, 2021 via Zoom. It was reported that the Christmas Basket/boxes recipients were down this year by 30. Polo Lifeline has been blessed with donations and they have plenty of food with fewer people coming in for food. Second Hand Rose is struggling with sales. Bill Hare reported that Honduras is locked down due to Covid and getting aid into the starving areas is difficult. Patty Stauffer is planning a Vacation Bible School this summer. The mentoring program at the school is suspended due to Covid.

Education: Pastor is planning to get confirmation students in 2 at a time, in person for reviews beginning sometime in March. Pastor is still thinking about confirmation in spring/summer. Pastor is considering having 1 student confirmed each week for 9 weeks as there are 9 students. A group photo can be done at some point. Pastor will survey the parents. This would be a special Sunday for each family and keep gathering numbers down for the good of our neighbors.

Property: Thank you to Ryan Nelson for plowing the church parking lot for worship. Parsonage: It has been determined by contract that the church is charged 10% of repair bills if Rochelle Realty contacts the repair companies for the parsonage. At this time Rochelle Realty has been contacting Merla and she then has been contacting repair people to save the fee. The following repairs have been completed at the parsonage; replacement of entry door lock, repair of washing machine, and exterminators for recurrent wasps. Merla and Lisa called for bids for a replacement furnace pump from Rockford Furnace and Loescher. A motion was provided to accept the estimate from Rockford Steam Boiler Works for \$1,620, this was approved.

Resignation: Toni resigned from the church council effective February 11, 2021. There are currently 3 openings for church council. Several names were recommended to be nominated to serve on the church council.

Old Business: Our annual meeting is pending and with a date to be determined at the March church council meeting.

New Business: The congregational Resourcing Event (usually held at Kishwaukee College) will be held online this year on Saturday, March 13, 2021 from 8:30 a.m. -2:00 p.m. Registration will be taken until March 7th with a cost of \$10.
