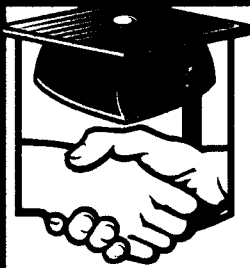
Apostolic Faith Bible College Inc.

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the body of Christ (Christians). And this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are as follows

- Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit
- Creation and Formation
- Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is conception of life.
- Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, a second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Baptism of the Holy Spirit: evidenced by the speaking in other tongues
- Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- Washing of feet
- Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- Destruction of the wicked
- Conditional immortality
- Rapture of the Man Child Class
- Return of Jesus Christ to earth again, bodily and visibly
- A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed doctrines.

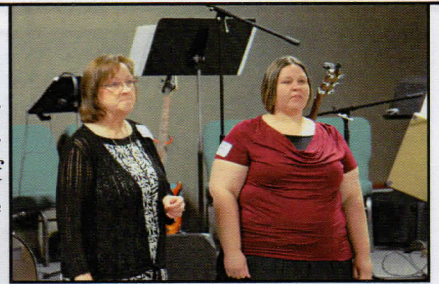

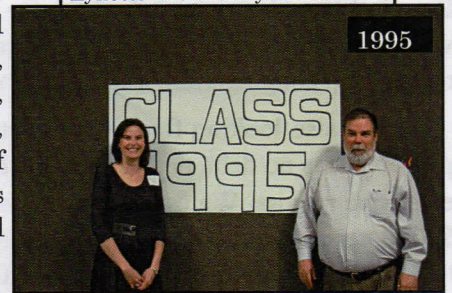

River of Life

Trapper Creek, Alaska

Greetings,

I am writing to ask you to pray and to help as God directs you. As some of you may know, River of Life is currently closed. My husband, Jay, and I founded this work in 1974. We spent many years pastoring in Trapper Creek and care very much about the community. It was a difficult decision for the Board to discontinue services last winter. Although Jay and I are very much involved in seeking a way to make this work succeed, we do not, at this time, believe that God is calling us to return to pastor. Therefore, the

Board of Directors is now looking for someone to pastor that work. We are asking God to send someone who would be willing to begin at the beginning and rebuild the congregation: a person who has a heart for reaching the community and nurturing a congregation. This person would need to raise support before they come and/or find work in the community.

We are also looking for people to stand beside them in prayer and/or financial support. The church owns the church property, has no debt, and the church building is in good condition. The mobile home intended to be a parsonage needs extensive repairs. We estimate the cost of those repairs to be at least \$5000.00. A pastor would need at least \$1500 to \$2000 per month for living expenses if the parsonage is made livable. Without the parsonage in service, another \$1000 to \$1200 per month would be needed for rent and electricity. In addition, the church budget, when it becomes operational, is projected at \$800 to \$1000 per month.

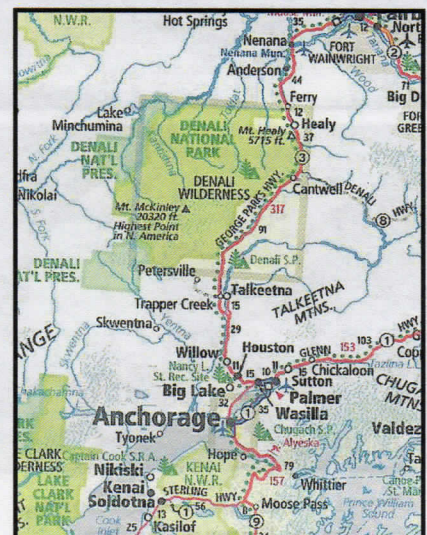
I would like to hear from you or anyone you know feels called to serve God in a small, rural, Alaskan community. We would also like to know if you are willing to help. That help could be in the form of a pledge for a one-time gift or monthly support when we find a pastor, or a commitment for labor on the repair of the parsonage if and when we are ready to take that step. A commitment to prayer would be greatly appreciated. Just passing the word along to anyone who may be willing to get involved would be a big help.

At this time I am handling communications from our home in Oregon. You may contact me by mail, telephone or email. In addition, the church has a Facebook page and I have a personal Facebook page. You are welcome to contact me through postings or messages on that system.

Thank you and may God richly bless you in all that you do.

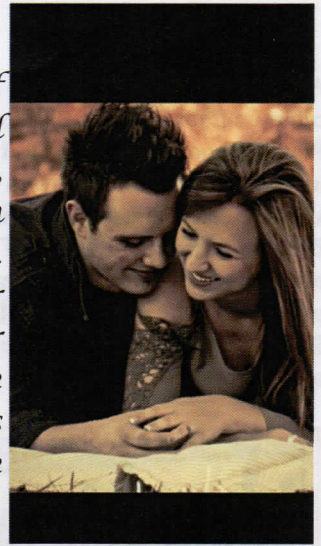

Seth and his family attends the Original Apostolic Faith Church in Joplin, MO under the ministry of Savoy and Karen Grimmer.

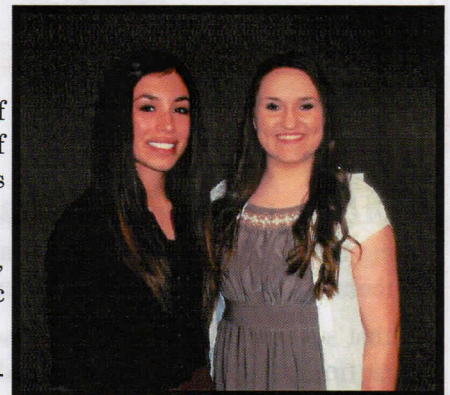
AFBC Scholarship Recipients

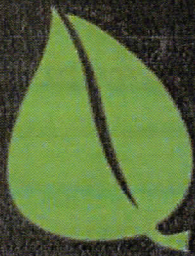
