#### **Sunday Reflection: Corpus Christi**

Today we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, popularly known as Corpus Christi which we eat and drink during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Jesus in today's gospel proclaims that he is the Living Bread, and "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day,". But the Jews could not understand what Jesus was saying. Upon hearing this

proclamation, they were scandalized because for them this was simply cannibalism. Is he crazy? This is also one of the reasons why Jesus' followers left him after His Bread of Life discourse (John 6). They could not accept this teaching. This was too much! But Jesus was not shaken. He continued to tell what had to be told even if they were scandalized and hurt. Jesus holds onto the truth without conditions. If Jesus changed His teaching, I'm sure we wouldn't have the Holy Eucharist today that we benefit from so much.

What is important is that Jesus promises eternal life to us who will eat His Body and drink His Blood. Do we believe in the word of our God, Jesus Christ who said: "This is my Body... This is my Blood..."? When we see bread on the altar, when we taste the Eucharist at the time of Communion, do we really believe that which we see and which we taste is the real Body of the Risen Christ, capable of giving us eternal life?

# Saint of the Week ... St. Anthony of Padua

St. Anthony of Padua was born in Portugal in 1195 to a wealthy family and was raised in the church. In 1220 he joined the Franciscan Order in hopes of preaching to the Saracens (Muslims) and be martyred.

On his way to Morocco, he became seriously ill and was forced to return home. However, his ship back to Portugal was blown off course and eventually landed in Sicily. Because of his continuing poor health, he was not allowed to pursue his missionary work among the Saracens. Instead, he taught theology in Italy and France.

He was greatly admired as a preacher and was noted for his simple yet profound teaching of the Catholic faith. He died on his way to Padua, Italy, where he is buried.

Anthony was the most celebrated of St. Francis of Assisi's followers and had the reputation of a miracle worker. In art he is shown with a book, a heart, a flame, a lily, or the child Jesus. Among his writings are sermons for Sundays and feast days which were published in 1979. Both Padua and Portugal claim him as their patron saint, but he is best known for being invoked for the return of lost property.
