FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - YEAR B **ADVENT SEASON**

The season of Advent has a twofold nature: it is a time to prepare for Christmas, when we 业 "recall Christ's First Coming among us, and it is a time when we look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of the ages. In this way Advent is a period of devout and joyful expectation" (General Norms for the Liturgical Year, 39). During Advent, each Sunday's Gospel reading has a specific focus. The Old Testament readings, especially those taken from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times. The selections from the writings of the Apostles present exhortations and instructions on different themes of this



This is the first Sunday of Advent and the first Sunday of the new L liturgical year (Year B). There are three aspects of anticipation to Jesus' coming in the Advent season: the celebration of his birth some 2000 years ago (past), receiving Jesus in our lives today (present), and his coming again at the end of time (future). Today's readings emphasize the third aspect when Jesus comes again in glory. In the Gospel Jesus speaks about the signs that will occur at the end of time and says, "Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man". Let us take time during this Advent season to examine our lives to prepare for that final day when we will meet God face to face.

December 4 - Memorial of Saint John Damascene, Priest, Doctor: Born in Damascus about 675, John became a monk and later a Priest near Bethlehem. The last of the Greek Fathers of the Church, John was a renowned scholar. One of his best-known works. The Fountain of Wisdom, had a great influence on later theology. John also wrote hymns and homilies in honour of the Blessed Virgin. He died about 750 and was named a Doctor of the Church in 1890.

December 6 - Memorial of Saint Nicholas, Bishop: In the early fourth century Nicholas was made Bishop of Myra in Lycia (now Turkey). He was famous for his charity and was so popular that he was chosen joint patron of Russia with Saint Andrew; he is also a patron of sailors and children. In many parts of the world, he still plays a role as Santa Claus.

December 7 - Memorial of Saint Ambrose, Bishop and Doctor: Ambrose was a catechumen who was later baptized and ordained, becoming Bishop of Milan. He became a remarkable preacher and teacher of the faith. His most famous student was Augustine of Hippo, whom he baptized. His literary works have been acclaimed as masterpieces of Latin eloquence, and his musical accomplishments are remembered in his hymns. In 1298, Ambrose was declared one of the four great Doctors of the Latin Church (with Jerome, Augustine and Gregory I).

December 8 - Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary: On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX defined the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception as a dogma of faith. This dogma states that the Blessed Virgin Mary "in the first instance of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin". On this day, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we celebrate our Diocesan Feast.

December 9 - Memorial of Saint Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin: On this date in 1531, the Blessed Virgin appeared to aboriginal convert Juan Diego at Tepeyac, near Mexico City, and told him that a Church should be built at the site of her appearance. As a result, the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico was built and is now a famous pilgrimage site. On another visit, Our Lady sent Juan Diego to gather flowers and present them to the bishop. When he did so, the flowers he had collected in his cloak fell away, revealing an image of the Blessed Virgin on his cloak. This relic is preserved in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Juan Diego was canonized in 2002.


