Chellie was born and raised in Milford. She was the 4th of 9 children. She began her career in the medical field when she started as a Junior Candy Striper at the age of 13 years old at Milford Valley Memorial Hospital. Dale and Chellie have 6 children and raised them all in Minersville. They were all taught the value of hard work and learned how to work well. In 1986 Jim and Dale sold out of the dairy business but kept their farm ground. Soon after this Dale went to work at Western Electro Chemical Corp in Cedar City. Chellie and the kids maintained and ran the farm while Dale worked away. Dale was with WECCO for the next 25 years until he had health issues that forced him into retirement. Dale and Chellie also served as EMT's in Minersville. Chellie served for 20 years and Dale for 15. Dale also was a member of the Volunteer Fire Department. When the kids were all in school, Chellie had the opportunity to return to school to pursue her nursing dreams. In September of 1996 she graduated from Sevier Valley Applied Technology Center in Richfield, Utah with her Practical Nursing Degree. She worked at the Milford Hospital as a LPN for the next 4 years. She then moved her employment to the Beaver Valley Hospital to take the position of the Director of Long Term Care. Chellie truly believes she has the best job in the whole world. Dale and Chellie said that with Dales illness came many blessings. They found out just how truly blessed they were to live in this AMAZING community. The entire town looked out for them. Knowing that Chellie was off to work they all took an Interest in keeping an eye on Dale and his "shenanigans" and made sure he was ok. For the past 6 years they have been the camp hosts at the Minersville Lake. Dale has found his "Niche". We all know how he loves to visit with people!! He loves to work at the campground and make it an inviting place for people to come back to. Dale and Chellie have 6 children and Spouses, 27 grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren, and so many more that call them Nana and Pa!! 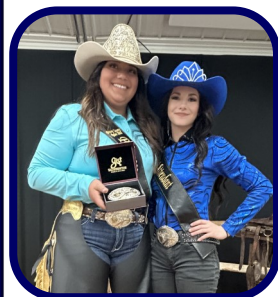

General Rules for Exhibit Open Class:

- 1) Exhibitors may enter only two items in each class per person.
- 2) An entry form must be completely filled out for all entries.
- 3) All items must be produced or prepared within the current fair year (August 2022-August 2023)
- 4) Entries are limited to Beaver County residents. Non-residents may enter items as display only.
- 5) The Beaver County Fair Board will not be responsible for any lost, stolen, or damaged items. All reasonable means will be taken to prevent loss or damage.
- 6) All items will be received from 2:00pm to 7:00pm on Tuesday, August 22, at the Fairgrounds, with the exception of produce and flower entries, which will be accepted on Wednesday, August 23 8:00am-11:00am.
- 7) Judging of entries will be on Wednesday, August 23rd
- 8) The exhibit building will be open on Thursday, August 24th from 3:00pm-7:00pm, Friday, August 25th from 1:00pm-7:30pm, and Saturday, August 26th from 10:00am-7:00pm
- 9) Exhibits will be judged and ribbons awarded in blue or red ribbons. Cash premiums of \$3.00 for blue ribbons and \$2.00 for red ribbons will be awarded.
- 10) Rosette ribbons will be awarded \$15.00 for Grand Champion, and \$10 for Reserve Champion or Judges Choice. There is a \$50.00 maximum on premium money awarded for open class exhibits, excluding rosette premiums. All items not claimed will become the property of the Beaver County Fair Board.
