Yeah!!!! We are at the beginning of the change of seasons. I know many will say that we still have a few cold days ahead, but I am going to be optimistic and believe that we will start to see warmer weather. I hope that many of you are like me and are ready for warmer weather, where we see the trees bud, the daffodils spring up and the beautiful sounds of birds singing in the morning.

Not only does the changing of the season bring warmer weather, but also a holiday that 49 States of our United States of America does not celebrate. That is Independence Day... to be clear Texas Independence Day which is on March 2nd. The day that the Texas Declaration of Independence was signed The only state in the Union to ever be its own sovereign republic. No other state can say that. Our Governor Greg Abbott once said, "The vision of freedom set down by our founders in the Texas Declaration of Independence lives on in the indomitable Texas spirit today. As we continue to build a 21st-century Texas, we must always remember how the sacrifices of past generations helped create a future for the next. At this time, I encourage all Texans to learn more about, reflect on, and take pride in our state's unique origins and rich history."

This reminds me that as Christians we should remind ourselves of those generations who came before us, who sacrificed, suffered and took the baton from those before them to preach the good news and expressed the love of Christ outwardly to those across the world. The first chapter of Acts records the last face-to-face conversation the disciples had with Jesus. They asked him a crucial question in Acts 1:6, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" It's a question we ask still today as we work to reconcile our current experiences with what we believe God has done in the past and will be doing in the future. Before the crucifixion, these same disciples had not understood Jesus' coming death and resurrection. Along the Emmaus Road after his resurrection, he connected for them the dots between the Old Testament and his death (Luke 24:13–27). It makes sense then that these same disciples wanted a little more clarity about the next steps after his resurrection. It makes sense that at times we still do as well. But Jesus didn't explain the details to them in Acts 1. Instead, in the next verses, he promised once again the coming of the Holy Spirit, who would equip them to be his witnesses to "Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Instead of explaining the details of what happened next, Jesus used language that reminded them (and us) of his instructions a few days before on a mountain in Galilee, recorded in Matthew 28.

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

Soon we will have a wonderful opportunity to come together to celebrate one of the most glorious and wonderful holidays of the year, Resurrection Sunday, or as most know it as Easter. I know I am talking about it a month early, but I want to mention it early so as to get everyone excited about it and planning to attend. My only ask is that you not only plan on being at church, but that you start discussing it with others that normally do not attend church on that Sunday. The first thing I would highly suggest is to pray. Pray for them to have an open heart and mind and then pray on how you can approach them and present that invitation. This is a time that we can not only honor our Lord Jesus but also those who have passed that baton to us so that we can "go and make disciples of all the nations". That nation starts with our own!

I look forward to seeing each of you these next coming Sundays where we get to worship Christ and love and support each other. Our next sermon series will be of the Psalms and please remember we will be starting back up our Adult Sunday School on March the 12th @ 10:15 to 10:45 am. Until we see each other then, may the Lord bless you and keep you.




