AGRICULTURE REPORT

Some dairy farms in Pennsylvania unexpectedly lost their milk market recently. Couple that with prolonged low prices and a cold, wet spring, times are challenging to say the least for dairy farmers.

The good news for these farmers is that several other processors stepped up to take the displaced milk. This prevented the farms from having to sell their cows or possibly even their farms. The bad news is that uncertainty remains when it comes to milk prices and just about everything else in the dairy industry.

One bright spot is that the MPP-Dairy program is letting farms reenroll for 2018 with better coverage options. Coverage can be even be purchased retroactive to the first 3 months of this year, meaning producers are guaranteed a payment for these months.

First and foremost, I would like to thank Berks County Grange for allowing me to attend the Mid-Atlantic Leader's Conference in Westminster, Maryland. The conference was quite different this year than in past years for the "Lecturer's Conference."

Leaders from all areas of the Grange, Junior, Youth/Young Adults, Program Coordinator, President/Master and any other interested Granger were in attendance. The participants who were competing in the Sign-A-Song, Public Speaking and Drill Teams were also present.
