10 And then shall many be offended, and shall betray one another, and shall hate one another.

11 And many false prophets shall rise, and shall deceive many.

12 And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold.

13 But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.

14 And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come.

15 When ye therefore shall see the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place, (whoso readeth, let him understand:)

16 Then let them which be in Judaea flee into the mountains: 17 Let him which is on the housetop not come down to take any thing out of his house:

18 Neither let him which is in the field return back to take his clothes.

19 And woe unto them that are with child, and to them that give suck in those days!

20 But pray ye that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the sabbath day:

21 For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be.

22 And except those days should be shortened, there should no fiesh be saved: but for the elect's sake those days shall be shortened.

24 For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew great signs and wonders; insomuch that, it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect.

25 Behold, I have told you before.

26 Wherefore if they shall say unto you, Behold, he is in the desert; go not forth: behold *he is* in the secret chambers; believe *it* not.

27 For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. 28 For wheresoever the carcase is, there will the eagles be gathered together.

29 Immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken:

30 And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory.

31 And he shall send his angels with a great sound of trumpet, and they shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.

32 Now learn a parable of the fig tree; When his branch is yet tender, and putteth forth leaves, ye know that summer is nigh;

33 So likewise ye, when ye shall see all these things, know that it is near, *even* at the doors.

34 Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled.

35 Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.

36 But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only.

37 But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

38 For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark,

39 And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

40 Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

41 Two women shall be grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

42 Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come.

43 But know this, that if the goodman of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up.

44 Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh.

45 Who then is a faithful and wise servant, whom his lord hath made ruler over his household, to give them meat in due season?

47 Verily I say unto you, That he shall make him ruler over all his goods.

48 But and if that evil servant shall say in his heart, My lord delayeth his coming;

49 And shall begin to smite his fellowservants, and to eat and drink with the drunken;

50 The lord of that servant shall come in a day when he looketh not for *him*, and in an hour that he is not aware of,

51 And shall cut him asunder, and appoint *him* his portion with the hypocrites: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh. Luke 21:28

Santification

Sanctification is a work of God, through the blood of Jesus. It is important to remember that it is only through Jesus Christ that we can have fellowship with God. For in John 14: 6-7 it states, "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life; no man cometh unto the Father but by me. If you had known me, you should have know my Father also; and from hence forth ye know him, and have seen him." Like the tabernacle in the wilderness there was only one entrance or way to the Holies. To God our Father there is only one way, and that is through Jesus Christ.

In the entrance of the tabernacle there is the Brazen Altar. In Psalms 118:27 it says, "God is the Lord, which hath shewed us light: bind the sacrifice with cords, even unto the horns of the altar." The Brazen Altar typifies the sacrifice or atonement of our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus, through the Holy Spirit enlightens and convicts the unbeliever. Like in the tabernacle where a lamb was sacrificed on the brazen altar for the sins of the people. Jesus became that lamb, without spot or blemish he gave his life for our sins. Bound with cords of love our Savior took our sins upon him that we may be justified before him as in Romans 3:24-25, "Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus: Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God"

Through Justification by Faith our past sins are forgiven and forgotten. We are reconciled with God. For God cannot look upon the sins of men. The only way is as we repent God looks upon our sins through the atonement of the blood of Jesus his Son. In this act of grace we are set free from the penalty of sin which is death, but are made alive to God and our names will be written in heaven, on the Lamb's Book of Life. Psalms 103: 10-12 reads, "He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is his mercy toward them that fear him. As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us.

At conversion we dealt with our past sins. At Sanctification, God deals with Sin. This may be confusing at first but can be explained. We commit sins. We are born under Sin. This Sin is our nature at birth. In Ephesians 2: 2-3 we read "Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience: Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others." It is by nature we are sinners. In Romans 7: 14 it says, "For we know that the law is spiritual: but I am carnal, sold under sin." Carnal meaning fleshly, until we are purged or come under the blood of Jesus, and submit our will to God, our desires are carnal and we are servants to sin. We must see ourselves as we truly are. We must realize that our own desires lead to death and destruction. So we see there is more to our salvation than just asking Jesus to forgive us, but we must Consecrate our lives to God. It is more than just a choice but in Romans 12:1 we find it is our reasonable service. "I beseech you therefore, brethern, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." It is reasonable service since Jesus sacrificed his life for us that we give ourselves completely to him. Jesus sacrificed his own life that he could live his life through us. In order to do this we must take this step of consecration unto the Lord. This is not an act of grace but an act of willingness on our part. We must submit our life as Paul did, that we can say just as Paul says in Galatians 2:20 "I am crucified with Christ; nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me, and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." We must realize within ourselves we are not able to live above sin, but with Christ we have that power over sin. This is what Sanctification is all about. It is that overcoming grace that God gives in Christ Jesus. We are changed in nature as in Rom. 12:2 where it says, "be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God." When we are Sanctified we set ourselves apart for holy purposes unto God, but again Sanctification is an act of grace where we are changed, to walk not after the flesh but after the Spirit. Not that we can't turn back to the fleshly ways or sin but it is our choice which path we choose. The decision of life with Christ or the wages of sin which is death is ours. A person that is sanctified must be born again as Jesus taught in John 3:3-6, "Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter the second time into his mother's womb and be born? Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh: and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit."

In Romans 8:7 we find, "the carnal mind is enmity against God," and in the eighth verse of the same chapter we see that "they that are in the flesh cannot please God." We must be born of the Spirit of God. Within the Spirit of God we have unlimited power against sin and the powers of Satan. For in Romans 8:11 we read, "But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also guicken (to make alive) your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you." The power over death, not physical death but spiritual death, dwells in us if God dwells in us. In our relationship with God we must realize if we do not obey God we are not of God but we are subject to Satan and he is our master. In Romans 6:16 it says "Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?" We must yield our whole self to God just as Jesus did in Luke 22:42, "Saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless, not my will but thine be done." In this statement he submitted his life to the Father in heaven In John 13:15 Jesus says, "For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you," Jesus showed complete submission to his Father in heaven so should we show submission, for Christ is our example. If we do not abide or follow after the Lord we will not be of God. In John 15:6 it says, "If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth

as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned." If we do abide in the Lord in John 15:7-8 we read, "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you. Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples," What fruit is it that we must bear to be in Jesus Christ. It is the fruit of the Spirit that must dwell in us. In Gal. 5:22, it says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law." If we have this fruit in our lives we know that we are Sanctified. For in I John 2:29 it states, "If ye know that he is righteous, ye know that every one that doeth righteousness is born of him." It is a life of righteousness, full of the fruit of the Spirit, and a life abundately. Just as Christ we will still be tempted and tried but we have a promise in I Corinthians 10:13 "There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it," To fully understand this promise we must read the next verse in the fourteenth verse it says, "Wherefore, my dearly beloved, flee from idolatry." To be able to allow this promise of overcoming sin we must flee idolatry or in other words, put God first and stay away from putting other things before Him. This is part of the renewing of our minds. Christ is no longer afar off to us but through the act of Sanctification we are able to put Christ first. We are truly able to serve, and love our Master.


As Sanctified people we have many wonderful promises and blessings to us. In Salvation God gave his son that we may be justified by faith. In Sanctification, Christ gave himself for us. He calls us the Church, and together we are one body in Christ serving him. In Ephesians 5:23-27, "For the husband is the head of the church: and he is the savior of the body. Therefore as the church is subject unto Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, that he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish." When we become Sanctified through Christ's blood we have made ourself ready for the marriage of the Lamb. In Revelations 19:7 it says, "Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready." Just like in a marriage between a man and woman so it is between Christ and the Church. In order to have a good marriage a person has to give his all. For a good relationship with Christ we must give our all. It would be impossible to have a meaningful relationship with a man and a woman if they never talked or had any interest in what the other desires. That won't be the case with Christs church. For the Sanctified will be ready, the old man of sin is brought down and defeated in their lives. They will be pure and their vessel will be a vessel unto honour, seeking and desiring holiness.

We have the promise of being the children of God and joint heirs with Christ, for in Romans 8:14-17 it says, "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God, and joint-heirs

with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together." At Sanctification or this new birth we are grafted into God's family. We have a Godly inheritance, an inheritance without limit, for God is our father and together with Christ we will be glorified. I see it as an agreement or covenant where if we give all to God, God gives all to us. What a wonderful Savior we have! Sanctification also prepares our lives for the indwelling of the Holy Spirit or more commonly called the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. In II Timothy 2:21 it says, "if a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work." So our master may fill our vessel unto honour with his precious Holy Spirit. Just as the priest washed at the laver, we must wash according to God's word through Jesus Christ. For Jesus gave himself for us as in Hebrews 13';12-13 it says, "Wherefore Jesus also, that he might Sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate. Let us go forth therefore unto him without the camp, bearing his reproach."

My prayer is that whoever reads this that "The very God of peace Sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." I Thessalonians 5:23.

August 3, 1919 - November 2, 1990


The Lord called Earl home to be with Him on Nov. 2, 1990. He was 71 years of age.

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Let My People Go

3500 years ago this message was given to the king of Egypt. The children of Israel were in captivity and in great trouble. But "the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob took them by hand and led them out of Egypt".

This was not the last time God's chosen people were in captivity, Many times their little country was conquered and taken from them. 70 years after Jesus was born, the Jews once more were "led away captive into all nations; and Jeruslem was trodden down of the Gentiles" just as Jesus told in Luke 21, 24.

"For, lo, I will command, and I will sift the house of Israel among all nations, like as corn is sifted in a sieve, yet shall not the least grain fall upon the earth. All the sinners of my people shall die by the sword..." (Amos 9,9.)

During the following years, the Jews were terribly persecuted. The French monk and philosopher Pierre Abe lard Wrote in 1135: "No other nation has ever suffered like this for God. Scattered among all nations....the Jews are burdened with heavy taxes... It seems like people think they honour God by maltreating the Jews."

During the so called "crusades", when the fallen church of Europe tried to "release the Holy Land from the Gentiles", the Jews suffered terrible. When the crusaders crossed the Rhine in 1096, they killed 12,000 Jews during a three month massacre. Similar persecutions took place in several European countries. After three years, the crusaders reached Jerusalem, and almost every Jew in that city was "slayed in the name of Jesus". Many Jews in different places decided to take their own lives instead of being captured by these soldiers who professed being fighting God's War.

During the centuries the Jews has been accused of famine and epidemics, wars and catastrophes. They have been persecuted and expelled from country to country. When Nazi-Germany started their "final solution of the Jews Question" and killed millions, they really just continued what others had been doing for centuries. This time also, the Jews had few places to flee. The United States did not accept any increase of imigration. Switzerland sent Jewish refugees back across the border, and Great Britain sent the almost sinking ships with Jews which reached the coast of Palestine back into the Mediterean. (Read the book: "While Six Million Died" Arthur D. Morse 1967.)

Through all the years in captivity, the Jews have greeted each other with the words: "Next Year in Jeruslem!" In 1948 when Israel once more became an independent nation, this was a sign which shows that God is fullfilling His promises.

"Behold, I will gather them out of all countries, whither I have driven them in my anger, and in my fury, and in great wrath; and I will bring them again into this place, and I will cause them to dwell safely," (Jeremiah 32,37)

"Behold, I will save my people from the east country, and from the west country; and I will bring them, and they shall dwell in the midst of Jerusalem." (Zechariah 8,7-8.) In the years after 1948, hundreds of thousands of jews have returned to their country. When the message of independence reached the land of Yemen, almost all of the 45,000 Jews in that country started walking towards their homeland. A corporation by the Israeli and British government made it possible to bring them back to Israel by air. These people had scarcely seen an aeroplane before, but they did not hesitate to enter the planes. They knew the Bible told they were to go home by "the wings of eagles". (Ex.19,4. Is. 60,8)

"Fear not: for I am with thee: I will bring thy seed from the east, and gather thee from the west; I will say to the north, Give up; and to the south, Keep not back; bring my sons from far, and my daughters from the ends of the earth." (Isaiah 43, 5-6)

Looking at a map, you will find that the country "north" of Israel is the Soviet-Union. Millions of Jews live there, and many of them are among the best educated people of that country. For years, there has been great troubles for the Jews in the Soviet Union, and very few have gotten permition to immigrate.

During the last years, when the social system of Communism has collapsed, people think this is because of the Jews. (Marx, Engels, Trotskij and many of the leading communists were Jews.) Anti-Semittism is spreading widely in the Soviet Union today, and the Jews are about to flee the country. They may have to pay one years salary to get out, but the line of people outside some of the immigration offices in Russia, may be miles long. Until now more than a million have sought for permition to leave, and during the first ten months of 1990, about 150,000 Jews had already arrived in Israel.

"Therefore, behold the days come, saith the Lord, that it shall no more be said, The Lord liveth, that brought up the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt; But the Lord liveth, that brought up the children of Israel from the land of the north, and from all the lands whither he had driven them: and I will bring them again into their land that I gave unto their fathers.

Behold, I will send for many fishers, saith the Lord, and they shall fish them; and after I will send for many hunters, and they shall hunt them from every mountain, and from every hill, and out of the holes of the rocks," (Jeremiah 16, 14-16)


