

(continued from page 2) actually celebrated on September 8, 1565 in St. Augustine, Fla. The Native Americas and Spanish settlers held a feast including bean soup and the Holy Mass was offered for their safe passage to the new world. A second similar "Thanksgiving" celebration occurred on American soil on April 30, 1598 in Texas when Don Juan Onate declared a day of Thanksgiving to be commemorated by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
