

The Beatitudes in the Words of Monsignor William King

Msg. William King's theme for the Corpus Christi Men's Retreat this year was focused on the Beatitudes. He pro-



vided engaging and peace filled lectures that were heartfelt and entertaining as well as enlightening and filled with the Holy Spirit. When you read the words "blessed are they who ..." or "blessed are the...", you should interpret that as you are on the right path if you ... I found this to be a great way to look at the Beatitudes with fresh eyes! Msg. King provided many blessed nuggets of wisdom such as: "Christianity is active: don't just sit there, do something! But when we pray we should have the mindset: Don't do something, just sit there!"


Msg. King went into great detail examining the first and second Beatitudes. Those who live in the way of "blessed are the poor in spirit" recognize that their breath is not their own; one who is poor in his own breath is also poor in their own pride. Those who are poor in spirit are called to be spiritual beggars; we beg God for what we need. We say "I don't need to fill my life with empty things or empty relationships. (points upwards) I have what I need."

What a wonderful retreat this was! Indeed, blessed were we, all of us who were able to attend it!



The new Book of the Month for July & August will be Habits for Holiness: **Small Steps for Making** Big Spiritual Progress by Fr. Mark-Mary Ames, CFR. This short book, approx. 130 pages, is a powerhouse of good, practical spiritual insights (inspired by St. Francis and Franciscan Spiritually in a real way) written by a young Capuchin Franciscan priest who currently does a number of popular media outreach initiatives online in our modern world [YouTube and Podcasting to name a few]. You will take many golden nuggets away from this book if you give it a




