Grilled chicken and potato salad- you can almost taste it, can't you? Kids running around the backyard, people swapping stories, the warm summer sun overhead- there is nothing quite like a good 'ol fashioned 4th of July picnic. We come together, break bread and celebrate...what? Well...the 4th of July! (Duh, pastor!) But what does that mean? What do we REALLY celebrate on that day? One word...freedom.

But what IS this freedom that causes us to gather and consume large quantities of tasty comestibles? (Yes, it's really a word!) The dictionary says, among many other things, that freedom is "the absence of limitation". Wow! That's REALLY what we celebrate? The short answer is...darn tootin', Fig Newton! But NOT in the manner you may think.

When we hear "absence of limitation", we might think it means we can do ANYTHING we want, anytime we want, without any restrictions. How cool would that be? Honestly, not as cool as it sounds at first blush. Imagine the anarchy inherent in everybody doing whatever they feel like, whenever they feel like.

The "absence of limitation" we actually have is based, in large part, on our ability to worship. We are free in this country to worship God as we see fit, when we see fit. No one is going to arrest us simply because we are openly Christian. We get to come to church on Sunday morning, park right out in front where everyone can see our car, happily walk in the building, and praise our Creator for all He does in our lives. What a gift! Many people in the world can't do those things without fear of persecution or worse.

This month, do two things for me: 1) celebrate the "absence of limitation" you enjoy, and 2) don't waste it. Come to church EVE-RY week (unlike the schools, we're opened year-around!) expecting God to do great things in the life of your family, your community, your world! God is good, all the time!

New Sermon Series(s)!

On Sunday, June 28, we began not one but two new sermon series! At both 8AM and 10:15AM on Sundays, we are focusing squarely on prayer as we ask the question, <u>How Do I Pray?</u> Each week focuses on a different aspect of prayer as we consider how those "pieces" create a "whole" that will help us gain a more complete understanding of prayer. The weeks of the series look this:

Sunday, June 28- The Prayer of Faith (James 5:13-15) When we pray, we are to believe in the power and goodness of God. (Proverbs 3:5-6, Hebrews 11:1-3)

Sunday, July 5- <u>The Prayer of Agreement</u> (Acts 1:12-14) After Jesus' ascension, the disciples all joined together constantly in prayer. (Joel 1:14, Matthew 18:18-20)

Sunday, July 12- <u>The Prayer of Request</u> (Philippians 4:4-7) We are to take our requests to God. (Daniel 9:16-17, Ephesians 6:18)

Sunday, July 19- <u>The Prayer of Thanksgiving</u> (Isaiah 12:1-2) It is right and good to offer thanksgiving to God. (Psalm 107:1-3, 1Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Sunday, July 26- The Prayer of Worship (Romans 12:1-2) Worship focuses on Who God is. (Psalm 95:1-3, Hebrews 12:28)

Sunday, August 2- <u>The Prayer of Intercession</u> (1Timothy 2:1-3) We are told to make intercession "for everyone". (1Samuel 12:22a-23, 2Thessalonians 3:1-3)

On that same Sunday, we started a new Sunday evening sermon series- <u>Healing Rain</u>. There are LOTS of examples of healing in the Bible, but what does "healing" REALLY mean? This series looks at 5 different types of healing as found in the Gospels and how they can impact our lives. Each week will feature a time of prayer and healing. The weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, June 28- Illness (Matthew 9:18-22)

Kindness and a generous spirit go a long way. It's like medicine- very healing.

Sunday, July 5- Immobility (Matthew 9:1-8)

Healing takes courage, and we all have courage, even if we have to dig a little to find it.

Sunday, July 12- Blindness (Matthew 9:27-31)

Part of the healing process is sharing with other people who care.

Sunday, July 19- Possession (Matthew 17:14-21)

Healing is a matter of time, but it is sometimes also a matter of opportunity.

Sunday, July 26- Death (Matthew 9:18-19, 23-26)

We can heal the world by healing one heart at a time.

Come each week expecting God to speak to you in powerful ways!





Independence Day

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a committee but with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4, 1776. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: "The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty...from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more." Adams' prediction was off by two

In a remarkable series of coincidences, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two founding fathers of the United States and the only two men who signed the Declaration of Independence to become president, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the United States' 50th anniversary. President James Monroe died exactly five years later, on July 4, 1831.

We have much to be grateful for in this country. Celebrate our nation's independence- thank God for our freedom!


AN OUTREACH IDEA
