

Michael was called away at that point. The Council continued to discuss the following:

5. Empty sanitizers and soap dispensers in the public bathrooms and the BDR and the EXR.
6. The front entrance door, when locked for the night, is too difficult to open all the way when someone enters. They must squeeze themselves through a small opening.
7. Waterfalls and features: They used to be turned off at night to conserve electricity. Now they are on all night.
8. Residents are still asking that the waterfall in the lobby be set on a timer that allows the Dining Room be quiet during those hours. The extra noise raises the level of conversation and those with hearing aids are especially affected, even when seated far away.
9. Music throughout the building: Soft, gentle generic music is welcome. Popular music from the 60s, 70s, 80s (often loud and indiscernible vocals) are not, according to the residents who have spoken up. Even some of the Hawaiian music is not gentle. Another resident said popular singers from the 50s was nice (Nat King Cole, E.G.) "Remember", said others, "we are of an older generation and wish for peace and quiet". It was also requested again that music be turned off during the meals. The noise level increases.
