


Youth Group

Guided by the Eyes of the Heart

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus spoke about two treasures (Matthew 6:19-20). We either seek "treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal" or "treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal." We are all treasure seekers because we either want to enjoy treasures on earth or treasures in heaven. Our choices, decisions, and actions are dictated by what we hold dear. What we treasure dictates how we think about ourselves and our relationships with others and most important with God.

So what is your treasure? What causes you to love the treasures or the things of this world or the treasure that God offers? Why do some of us follow one path and others a different one? God gives us two eyes to see, and they are an enormous help for our existence. However, they do not provide help as to which treasure we serve. In his book *Redeeming Money*, Paul David Tripp suggests that we have another pair of eyes and those eyes are eyes of the heart. This set of eyes makes up an important part of our vision system. He wrote:

The eyes of the heart are always envisioning something. They are always fixed and focused on some hope, some dream, something you value. What the eyes of your heart envision will shape what your physical eyes look for and notice. Your physical vision is not neutral. No, it is guided by the eyes of your heart...What, for you, is the treasure dream that shapes the way you see your world? What physical things get your focus because they connect to the treasure that has already commanded the focus of your heart?...The treasures of your heart will always shape the way you see.

Later in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money" (verse 24). Jesus is telling us that either God or money will be our treasure and become the master in our hearts. We are told that we can't serve both God and money. In this verse, Jesus points out that money above everything else can keep our hearts from making Him their treasure. We can say that no heart is free. As Jesus said, we either seek treasures on earth or in heaven.

As sinful people, our hearts are inclined to seek treasures on earth. Only with God's Word working through the Holy Spirit can the grip that money and material things have on us be broken. In our prayers, let us ask God not only to give us good eyesight, but, more important, to give us even better vision with the eyes of our hearts so that we can clearly see the treasures in heaven which will give us joy and peace on earth and life eternal with Jesus.

From Pastor's Desk

Summer is here! After winter and a cool Spring we can finally enjoy the warmer weather and watch creation grow. With school being done, there's a feeling that summer is a time of rest and rejuvenation. I hope that happens for you this summer. We need to rest and reset, and summer goes by fast.

We need rest because life is hard. We work hard, we keep busy schedules, we have to. Bills must be paid. Income is needed to make it through. We want our families to have the best we can give. We may even find pleasure and fulfillment in work. We also need to slow down and enjoy the long warm days. But what gives you real rest? If you're like me, everything that I say brings me rest, also feels like lots of work sometimes. Vacation, as much as we want it, is lots of work, too (new beds, new places, crowds, hectic schedules, you know the drill). And we get tired and cranky and need rest!

Jesus says, "Come to me all you who are heavy burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). The rest Jesus gives is the rest achieved on Good Friday- It is finished! The curse of Adam which brought sin, sickness, division, stress, and hard work is overcome. But we still wait for the final end to all that. In the meantime, we need rest. Here's a short list of ideas to keep resting this summer.

- Come to church- not online, but in person. It's only an hour. We need Jesus' forgiveness and life that brings what we can't give ourselves.
- Read a bible passage a day or maybe even a small section of one of the Epistles or Psalms- Go slow- soak it in!
- Take a prayer walk- walk and pray- I myself find this to be a huge blessing (BTW if I don't notice you when I'm walking this might be why.)
- Come to Bible Class- and learn and grow. It's good to feel accomplished and know that the Lord has done big things in His Word for you.
- Put technology away- As much as it is useful, it's a terrible addiction that drains us and most of the time produces nothing.

 Learn to relax and let go of the drama.
- Read a book. A real one with pages. I have recommendations for you. Excite your imagination.
- Learn to make memories by doing the small things.
- Grow a garden or just plant something. It's fun to watch things grow.
- Take a Sunday drive- I know the price of gas is high, but see the countryside. We live in a beautiful place.
- Neighbor- older generations speak of "neighboring" where neighbors and families got together to eat and visit. Try it out.

There are infinitely more opportunities but here are some things to think about and try. Winter comes quickly. Get some rest in Jesus this summer-you need it.


