Irwin Walter Marquardt, 91, of Petoskey, formerly of Bad Axe, died on January 5, 2003 at his home. He was born on June 18, 1911 to the late Fred and Albertina Marquardt in Port Hope. Irwin married Elinore Nugent on July 5, 1937. He graduated from Ingram Country School. He taught at Lawitzki Country School from 1931 to 1939. From 1939 to 1974, he was employed at Detroit Edison. Irwin was a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church in Bad Axe. He was an Edison Club president, Lutheran Church president, and served as secretary and treasurer for the Chamber of Commerce. He was the president of the Lion's Club, from which he received a 50-year Lion's pin. He served as Justice of the Peace at Verona Township from 1942 to 1947. He was a member of the Florida's Citrus Mountain Civic Association for 26 years. For the past three years, Irwin resided with his wife at Independence Village in Petoskey.
