OPENING (based on Psalm 150)

- L: Lord God, ruler of the universe, you rescue your people from adversity even as you delivered your own Son from the grasp of death. (Psalm 3)
 - A: Shield us from danger, and raise us up on the last day with all your saints to dwell with you in your eternal kingdom. Amen.
