Celebrating 15 Years of Service 2013 is going to be a banner year for the Greater Buckeye Lake Historical Society

History of the Society

It is hard to believe that the museum has been open for that many years. There have been over 40,000 visitors through the doors to see the history of this small town and lake.

In September, 1994, a group of interested people came together for the purpose of starting a Historical Museum in the Buckeye Lake area. This was to preserve the historical record of the Lake, including the Amusement Park, the Ohio Canal, the Interurban, the National Trail, the early pioneers and early boaters. Just the history of it all! The group met in the Civic Association building on Hebron Road and from the first, all were very enthusiastic.

Donations began to appear: A gun from the shooting gallery, a Rocket Ship and a Bug Car from the old Park, a piano that had arrived in Hebron in 1840, roller skates, swim suits from Crystal Pool, photos, cards and other memorabilia. Phil and Betty Holtsberry Clark gave us an old log cabin built around 1840.

Donna Braig, having gotten the group together, conducted the first meeting and was later elected as the first president. Kathie Brussee was the co-chairman. Karen Kentosh, a gal who grew up at the Lake, said she would be Secretary and David VanSicke who was manager of the National City Bank, agreed to be the Treasurer.

The first 'general membership' meeting was held at the Lions Clubhouse in Millersport and a slide show was presented by historian Chance Brockway. In 1996, the Society had 200 members who paid a membership fee of \$10. Moneymakers were needed. Going into the second year, the Society found membership totals reaching 250 members.

Since those humble and exciting beginnings, the Society has seen many changes: The Queen of the Lake II Tour boat, 2 additions to the building, the management of Cranberry Bog, enlarged gift shop, an entire estate was bequeathed to the society, 6 boats have been donated and one canoe. In the beginning,

there were 10 volunteers along with countless others that donated their time to the building of the museum. It has now grown to include a paid director and over 70 volunteers. We have a fantastic website, thanks to a volunteer, a Facebook page and we are open 6 days a week. The Queen has taken over 20,000 passengers on tour, with several hundred of those passengers going to see Cranberry Bog, our most famous asset.

My Buckeye Lake Memories

Historian, founder of the historical society and lifelong resident of Buckeye Lake, Donna Braig, has authored her second book, entitled *My Buckeye Lake Memories*. It has been released and she will have a **book signing on May 26 at the Historical Society 15 Year Anniversary Celebration.** At the age of 86, she has put her





stories to print once again about people, places and things she experienced while growing up in Buckeye Lake and Hebron.

In *My Buckeye Lake Memories*, Donna provides vivid accounts of life during the Great Depression, some good, some

not so good, but always told from a personal perspective. Canal boats, school events, organizations, important families and individuals

and the famous "Playground of Ohio" Buckeye Lake Amusement Park, are just a few of the interesting stories.



Donna's first book, *My Buckeye Lake Story*, in its third printing has sold over 5,000 copies. It

is a complete history of the area with humorous stories of events at Buckeye Lake Park where Donna worked as a young woman.

Honoring Local Residents & Businesses

The Society has been honoring local residents and local businesses since 1999 as historical sites around the lake. There are 27 sites honored by a plaque at each resident or business and at the Museum. The first two honored were Sayre Brothers Marina and Lions Club House in Millersport. Cully House in Hebron, Taylor's North Bank cottage, Fisher's Marina and Weldon's Ice Cream are just a few of the honored sites. Every site owner will be invited to the May 26th Anniversary event.

One of those historic sites honored is the Thomas Cully House in Hebron, Ohio which was built in 1830. It was placed on a working Indian mound and The Historic Thomas Cully House

was also part of the Underground Railroad. The land bordered the Ohio Canal where Mr. Cully built two large warehouses. The House is described as a Federal Vernacular.


