





Some of our readers chose not to get into the dog story; I admit, the books are a "bit" rough at times - after all they are set in the days of gold in the Klondike. **Demon Copperhead by Barbara** Kingsolver was the choice of the HBG book club (stands for the Hurley Burley Girls...a reference to the war in Macbeth...oh, never mind! :-) ). This group is made up of one from Defiance, another from Toledo, an Oregonian on ZOOM, and me. Anyway, Kingsolver decides to take the social problems that Charles Dickens rails against in David Copperfield, rewrite them into the 1990's eastern Virginia Appalachia and address the ills of "modern" society. The foster care program and rescription opioids seem to be the two big topics. Each character is a rewrite of a main



character in the original novel by Dickens. Much could be said about the "why" here - it seems like much work to do an updated version of a book, to imitate the original. My jury is still out on this read. I do know it won the 2023 Pulitzer Prize for 2023, sharing the award with Trust, a book I have not yet

HBG is reading The Four Winds for this month by Kristin Hannah. It is not a typical writing from this author. I may have already mentioned in the past newsletter that this novel addresses the great Dust Bowl of the thirties. It is a tough story.

Just finished last night, Louise Penny's latest, A World of Curiosities. I thoroughly enjoy her mysteries. After 20 books, we know the residents of Three Pines so well. One should always be suspicious of any new person who moves in!!!!!!!!

Our daughter Rachael recommended She Who Became the Sun by Shirley Parker-Chan. The only problem I have when she recommends a book to me? I spend much of my reading time wondering what exactly did she like about this book that she wants me to read it as well. It is labeled fantasy, is set in the 1300's of Mongolian China. A young lady sees her brother, whose fortune had recently claimed he would find greatness in his life, murdered by marauders. SHE takes up his name and his fortune and follows his fate. **Imagining Renewal Microgrants** 



#### Making Disciples: Jacinda Jones

acinda Jones of Trinity, Arcadia, was a student in Pastor Will Stenke's Diakonia class on Breakersti's Pastor Will Stenke's Diakonia class on Proclamation when she began to dream of a way to engage her community in a new way. For her final project, Jacinda was tasked with identifying the unique gifts and needs of her neighborhood and how she might use those elements to engage her neighbors. She imagined what it would look like to nurture a new community beyond the walls of her church, an exercise that Jacinda said, "helped me see my vision" for ministry "in a different way".

Jacinda and her family are regulars at a local seasonal campground in Van Buren, OH, participating in the close-knit community that springs up every summer as folks set up their campers and return to relax together on the weekends. She realized that on Saturday mornings, there is a window of time before the pool opens that the kids of the campground typically get restless. Jacinda developed intentional programing to fill the 30 minutes; a bible story time, followed by a related craft and snack. After presenting the plan for her final project, Jacinda applied and was awarded a 2021 Imagining Renewal Microgrant to begin the weekly activities, which she dreamed could be a "stepping-stone for building community at the campground". She developed 12 weeks of programming around bible stories from the Old Testament through the resurrection, and sometimes up to twelve kids, from preschool age up to pre-teen, would join her, eager for something fun to do before the pool opened. It was a unique time for the kids to "cut loose and have fun before they ran off for the day". After the 12 weeks of programming, when students had gone back to school, Jacinda got a call letting her know that several kids in the campground had still shown up on Saturday morning, looking forward to a bible story and activities.

Jacinda has hopes to further nurture and expand this outreach into "a vacation bible school... or weekly bible study for the parents" next year. Jacinda is excited to continue imagining what the Holy Spirit might be up to in her community! She is a member of the second cohort of the Innovator Learning Academy, and was recently admitted to Wartburg Seminary as a candidate for Word and Sacrament.

What are Microgrants? Microgrants funding are made possible through generous donors just like you. So far these gifts have made \$60,000 available for supporting innovative projects. We pray that this generosity will seed further generosity from those who value this ministry and have experienced its impact on their community. Each awardee organization will be asked to prayerfully consider how in the future they may aspire to join in this generosity and give back to the Imagining Renewal Fund. Microgrant recipients are asked to aspire to give back at least 10% of the grant monies awarded in the year following the completion of their proposed project.
