Whether or not the current seat holders or others will run will be made certain soon, as the deadline for filing nomination papers is Sept. 19 at 5 p.m. The nomination papers are due to the board secretary, Lori Robertson, at the District office before 5 p.m. Sept. 19 with signatures from 50 electors.

A candidates forum will be held Wed. October 9 at the District offices at 1486, Highway 6, NW near Oxford. At 6:30 p.m.

The election will be November 5, 2019. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.
