We are happy to have resumed and the February 17th meeting was an experiment for us as we did a live ZOOM event tying in our guest speaker, the live audience with our remote audience. The topic of the evening was Lubrication given by guest speaker Eivind Stenersen

with many credentials including Certified Lubrication Specialist & Vice President of Technology at Lubrication Technologies, Inc. Many specifics were covered from lubrication principals, base oils, additives, and their function. His talk covered everything we wanted & needed to know about that decades old question; What should I run in my Model A? He also introduced a new buzz word - Tribology and kept in perspective the oils used at the time our vehicles were made in relation to what is available today. We all left with a much greater understanding of how to decode all those oil choices for all of our needs, not just the Model A.

March 17th, we have Phil Zins scheduled an in depth look at how he designed and built an auto rotisserie for his restoration project.

KEYS - Darel Leipold will have key blanks and his key cutter at the March clinic if you need some made for original Ford locks used on the Model A. Bring your key or the number that is found on the lock. Darel can cut a key based on the Ford number associated with the lock.


Old wiring, a dirty gas tank, gummed up carburetor and other aches and pains of the car sitting still for this long period has kept Jim busy. Things were getting freed up, a new battery, weeks of gently turning over the engine with a splash of oil down the cylinder bores. Checking this, checking that, and finally getting ready to see if it would fire. A few members of the club have assisted in the process of getting this car ready to be started after its long slumber. On a very cold day a few members gathered for the moment of truth.

Key on, fire extinguisher nearby, cameras ready, crossed fingers, gas on and club members in the cheering section. Jim hits the starter, chug, chug, two, three revolutions and it wants to start. Second try - starts to catch, runs for a moment – cheering section lets out a cheer, Jim breaks into a smile, try's again and it runs a little longer, smoke starts to cloud our view, and it's running!!

It's running well and the oil in the cylinder bores that was splashed in is burning off although Jim may have over done the lubrication as the smoke is getting thick. February Restoration Clinic

The topic of our second restoration clinic this year was a discussion on lubrication oils. We were very fortunate to have an expert in the lubrication technology field present. Mr. Eivind Stenersen works for a very large lubrication formulation company in our area company and is a specialist in the science of oils and lubrication. We were guided thru the make up and blending of oils, how they react to heat, wear factors and what the additives do or don't do to protect the machinery they are used in.

One of the facts Mr. Stenersen mentioned is that 20% of the energy is consumed by friction. With that statement, the importance of the correct selection of lubricants is extremely important for the longevity of the equipment.

A few take aways for those that were not able to attend, We experimented with a zoom meeting format which allowed real time attendance and the ability for our zoom attendees to ask questions of the presenter. Although an experiment it went off well and with some additional planning we may be able in the future to use this format again.

The oils of the 1930's are no comparison to what we have now, if you have a clean engine (it's been rebuilt, or the pan has been dropped and cleaned) you should go with a detergent oil. Any major oil brand seems a good choice, recommendations as good choices are a deisel rated oil, 10w-30 or 15W-40. These have a built in additive package that play well with our type of engine.

Our attendance increased by about 10 people over last month for this meeting and our internet attendance was 17 members.

We have Lois Agrimson and her family once again to give a loud Thank You! For donating this space for us to meet in memory of her husband Russ who was a fixture at our clinics.
