Editoral Comment...

WINTER - SHOWS IT AS IT IS.


Winter has never been my favorite time of the year. Oh it is beautiful when the snow piles high and covers everything, then even the garbage dump and every ugly weed patch and junk heap looks like an artist's masterpiece. But the beauty of the snow doesn't last long, as a rule it soon melts and is gone and then things take on their original hue. It is so cold and our pace is slowed down and we can't get out and go and get things done. I like Spring with the budding of new life everywhere: flowers, grass, trees, shrubs, and fields all decked out in an array of color with God's variegated greens in abundance in all directions. Summer is a favorite time too; when we can gather sweet yellow ears of corn, ripe, red tomatoes, okra, fresh green beans and all the other good vegetables God provides. The flowers are still in abundance along with the fields of ripened grain on every side ready to be harvested. Then there is the Autumn with the whole world putting on its show of colors of a different hue, deep reds, golds, ambers, a variety of browns and sprinkled with the fading greens; it's always been the best time of all for me. I like the briskness in the air — the temperature is neither too hot nor too cold and the vitality that was lost in the heat of the summer returns. But this year winter has taken on a new and wonderful meaning to me and I have learned some lessons from it.

Winter shows it as it is. In the other three seasons of the year the crops in the fields and pastures, the leaves on the trees, and the foliage on the underbrush hide the real contour of the land and cover the real shape of the limbs of the trees and the underbrush; but in winter the trees and bushes are bare for the most part and even the leaves on the ground have been carried away by the winds, the crops have been harvested and the ground is ploughed, the cattle have grazed the pastures bare and there is nothing to hide the view. Hills and mounds, holes and crevices, places washed out by the wind and the rain, twisted, bent and broken tree limbs are all in plain view with nothing to hide or camouflage. . . It is absolutely amazing what the bareness of winter reveals, and at the same time our pace is slowed down so we can really see if we will.

Oh, we enjoy the Springs, Summers and Autumns of our life, but when the good Lord sends a cold winter's blast our way, straight from the North, and suddenly all the color, foliage and good things of life seem to disappear, we cry, "O, Lord, Why do we have to have the winter? It's cold and bare and I don't like it." But it is then the Lord lets us get a glimpse of things as they really are. We can start to reconsider and find out what is really important to us in the light of eternity, and to sort out the essentials from the non-essentials; to see clearly the broken vows that need mending, the twisted, crooked places that need straightening, the holes that need to be filled up, and the mounds that need to be pushed down, so things can be leveled off. We are made to face plain reality. God makes no mistakes; His winters in life are for a purpose. Trees that have stood the storms of winter, with their fierce winds, snow, sleet and rains, have become stronger and their roots have gone down deeper into the good old earth. The weak ones that couldn't take it are uprooted and lay prone by their side. Oh yes, God knows His business, His winters are for a purpose, and may I never forget the lesson He has taught me through them. The bleak, barren, uncoveredness of winter speaks to us in a thousand ways if we but take heed. God knows we humans all too well. He sends winter only one season out of four. He gives three times as much beauty and covering as bareness and plainness. He must have known we couldn't face stark reality any more often than that — for Winter Shows it as it is. Do we dare to take a good look?

The question is how far will iniquity be allowed to go before God puts an end to it?

People, generally speaking, do not think for themselves but in groups as followers, but there still has not been a time in history when everyone agreed on one standard of thought or behavior as being right. But there is coming a time when men as a whole will believe a lie and fully accept one standard of vast unrighteousness and no one will be able to change their course.

The conditions of men's minds in the short period preceeding the second coming of Christ is very much like psychosis. Psychosis may be defined as: fundamental lasting mental derangement characterized by defective or lost contact with reality. The minds of humanity will be turned from fundamental truths of the scripture and they will put their confidence in lies and deception. Men will be so possessed by corruption that there will be no room for a decent thought or any remembrance of God. They will mentally escape from the reality of judgment and the mighty power of God. Their condition will be more than lasting it will be permanent.

To more fully understand any subject one must know something about its history. Sin has a history surpassed in length only by the history of life itself. Sin has snowballed down through the ages cntil it has reached the dynamic proportions of today. This growth has only been briefly checked by reformers at various times. The Bible gives us the history of the gradual downward trend of mankind in the first chapter of the book of Romans.

Romans 1:21

Because that when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were

thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened

Man at the time when man began to multiply on the face of the earth did not create God or accidently discover Him. But there was a time when all men knew God but they fell away because they failed to worship and obey God. Next we see that they turned to their vain imaginations. Wherefore God also gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts, to dishonor thir own bodies between themselves.

Idol worship grew out of man's backslidden state. Anything is possible when men forsake God. There are multitudes of people all over the world that sincerely and faithfully sacrifice and give their lives for the sake of dumb idols. They have been made to believe a lie, but they cherish it as the truth. Mocking and speaking against God is not a new thing. If a man admits that there is a God in heaven, he must either serve Him or recognize that he is a transgressor against God. No man has even desired to be guilty or condemned; therefore humanity has preferred to deny the reality of God rather than admitting guilt. The lust of the flesh and the worshipping of individuals has also been another point that has dropped civilization to the low level that it is today.

Romans 1:28

And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do these things which are not convenient;

What was the result of failing to worship God, false wisdom, idol worship, blaspheming God, and the lust of the flesh? A reprobate mind incapable of comprehending the truth was the result of man's continual rebellion. Through these few downward steps men fell from the state of integrity with God to iniquity without a knowledge of the true God.

Before the flood we see civilization in a dangerous position.

Genesis 6:5

And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.

It could be very correctly stated that the minds of men at this time were reprobate. When the mind is so completely corrupted it could be said that a person is rotten to the core and fit only to be destroyed.

At one time Israel was found in a condition that we would especially like to take note of.

Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush; therefore shall they fall among them that fall: in the time of their visitation they shall be cast down, saith the Lord.

Jeremiah 8:12

The tendency to blush is a very good indication of any nations moral standing because it cannot be forced like other expressions neither can it be held back. When any individual or nation gees to the place when they cannot blush, they stand in a place that if not changed will soon lead to the judgment and wrath of the Almighty.

Genesis 19:14

They like many others did not give a serious thought to the future and therefore they were not prepared for it. This attitude was also reflected in the Hebrew people as recorded in I Cor. 10:7b.

I Cor. 10:7b

. . . The people satdown to eat and drink and rose up to play.

This is another sign that spells danger to any people.

All of these things that have been the downfall of nations in the past should be lessons for people to learn by today and escape these pitfalls. But, instead of improving one can see humanity making these same mistakes over again. If one travels down the same road as those in the past have traveled, he can be sure that he will arrive at the same destination.

As history teaches a good lesson in the series of events and results, biblical prophecy places us in time in relation to the plan of God. The Bible not only reveals the past estate of man, but as nothing else possibly can, it accurately foretells the future. How does the modern 20th century stand according to history and prophecy? What will the condition of men's mind be when God says it is enough? Will conditions, morals and philosophy become better or worse? One can only turn to the Word of God for the answer.

The world today and the United States stand in greater peril than all those before who have done wickedly because they have had a greater opportunity than many before them. Prophecy declares that in the last days there will be people:

11 Timothy 3:5

Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away.

In the United States we now have more preaching, more Bibles available and more Bible study helps on the market than ever before. Because of the freedom of religion in this country, it is easier for a person to be a Christian than it has ever been in all history. The sad fact is that dedicated Christians are few and on the decrease while sin is on the constant increase.

Matthew 24:12

And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold.

"One of America's leading racketeers casually boasted a short time ago: 'Organized crime is bigger than the United States Government.' Crime grosses close to 10 per cent of the American national income. And, one of the world's great historians has said, "The moral deterioration in the West will destroy us by the year 2000 A. D. even if the Communist do not!' "The crimes

committed in the world every day equal all those that are recorded in the Bible. In the past few decades mankind has gone beyond that which was thought to be the ultimate of ungodliness.

The trends of thought that have spelled defeat and destruction for ungodly people in the past are being taught as truth in our institutes of higher learning today. The Bible plainly warns af this type of condition.

II Timothy 4:3, 4

For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears;

And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables. II Timothy 3:7

Ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth.

Men who are proclaimed to be the wisest are swaying men's thoughts toward a godless philosophy that will effect every phase of life as we know it. "From many university classrooms come these conclusions:

First, man is only an animal.

Second, existence is a chemical accident.

Third, the struggle for survival has made man what he is.

Fourth, morality and standards of conduct are derived only from a sociological context.

Fifth, man lives in and for this world only, and any other thought is unscientific.

Each of these conclusions have further implications. The first point would mean that man is not a living soul and he is no more responsible to God than a dog. The second conclusion discredits God in His marvelous work of creation. The third statement worships man, the creature; and gives him all the credit for the accomplishments of the human race. This statement denies that there is a God in heaven who raises up who He will and puts down who He will. The fourth conclusion implies that man is free from any moral responsibility and that an act is wrong only if society thinks it is wrong. Therefore, the moral standard is constantly changing and nothing is really ever evil or bad, people just think it is. The fifth conclusion is perhaps the most damaging. It implies that there is no life after this one, no judgment, no punishment for sin. This fifth point considers an all-out, sacrificing service to God as foolish and a waste of time. These five points include every kind of deceptive thinking and will lead to every transgression that is mentioned in Romans 1:21-32. The human race is less than a step away from a reprobate mind according to the trend that history has followed in the past.

Jesus gave His followers a very good description of the conditions at the close of this age in the twenty-fourth chapter of Matthew.

Matthew 24:5, 11

For many shall come in my name saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many.

11 And many false prophets shall rise, and shall deceive many.

Are we living in this time or is it yet to come? M. R. DeHaan says, "I am told that, in the past fifty years, no less than eleven hundred leaders, great and small, in various parts of the world, have claimed to be the Christ and the Savior of the world. They have called themselves by the names of God, Divine Fathers, the Great I Am's and a thousand other movements claiming the perogatives of Christ and of deity. All of them have claimed deluded followers by the thousands in fulfillment of Jesus' words, 'and they shall deceive many.'

False teachers abound on every hand. These teachers do their part to add to the caose of the day. Men's minds are becoming so deceived by false doctrines that they do not recognize the truth when they see it. False security is far worse than acknowledged insufficiency. These men were well prophesied of in the Bible.

II Peter 2:1, 2

But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that brought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction.

And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of.

The Bible also pictures men and nations in this last time as being worried, perplexed; and some will die as a result of their fears of the things they see coming to pass (Luke 21:25, 26). "Historians of the future may label this present time The Age of Anxiety. Although in some ways we have less to worry about than previous generations, we seem to do more worrying. Although we have it easier than our forefathers, we have more uneasiness. Although we have less cause for anxiety, we are more anxious. Calloused hands were the badge of the pioneer, while furrowed brows are the insignia of modern man."

The scripture further describes the dreadful condition of men and the world at the close of this age in II Timothy.

II Timothy 3:1-4

This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come.

For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy,

Without natural affection, trucebrakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good,

Traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God.

"The modern world moves amidst it baffling dilemmas. While we know more economics than ever before, the world has more poverty and hunger than ever before. With our space program readying a flight to the moon, we have not yet solved the basic problems of earth. The threat of war and revolution hangs over our heads like the sword of Damocles. While psychiatry and psychotherapy promise us a whole personality, there are more nervous disorders and mental illnesses than ever before.

PSYCHOSIS (Concluded)

Trouble and danger lie ahead. This present generation of young people can expect nothing but crisis, bloodshed, war, hate, greed, lust, and struggle as the world tries to readjust without the climate of peace.

Some may ask, "What remains to be fulfilled before the Lord will come back as far as the human mind and deception is concerned?" One main even remains to be accomplished before the consumation of deception.

II Thessalonians 2:3, 4

Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition;

Who opposeth and exaulteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, shewing himself that he is God.

At the time the anti-christ comes to power wickedness will abound as never before. There will be no more barriers to stop crime. During his reign over the earth all unconverted humanity will be deceived into worshipping him as God. He will have power over all the earth and will even be able to overcome the children of God for a season.

Revelation 13:7, 8

And it was given unto him to make war with the saints, and to overcome them: and power was given him over all kindreds, and tongues, and nations.

And all that dwell upon the earth shall worship him, whose names are not written in the book of life of the Lamb slain from the fundation of the world.

There are those who have some knowledge of Bible prophecy and are not converted who say that they will not be deceived at that time. But the deception which will come upon the earth at that time will be so great and powerful that they will be deceived without ever knowing it until it is too late. The avenues for this deception have already been prepared. "The movies and television with equal ease lead and change the nation's thoughts on politics, morals, and social questions of great improtance. In the darkness of a living room or theater, where people sit relaxed to give undivided attention to the flashing pictures, psychological conditions are perfect for insinuating ideas into the mind. In test after test among high school and university students, it has been proven that a movie or a television program can brainwash. It is almost terrifying to note the way in which crowds can be swayed to believe almost anything, provided it is put in a form that travels the avenues along which they are accustomed to receive their knowledge, whether it be true or false. Some of the leaders of the world are already prepared to accept the anti-christ. A European statesman said recently: "If the devil could offer a panacea for the problems of the world, I would gladly follow the devil."

The distorted and reprobate mind that will result from the deception in these last days will be a condition that is permanent. One reason that these people are beyond hope is because God will lift His hand from

their lives and will send them strong delusion (II Thess. 2:11, 12). The second reason their condition will be permanent will be because they will receive the mark of the beast and by this their destiny is sealed.

Revelation 14:9, 10

And the third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, If any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand,

The same shall drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is poured out without mixture into the cup of his indignation; and he shall be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels, and in the presence of the Lamb.

There will not be any way to turn these men to God. Before this time they have refused God's plea of love and mercy. During this period of time immeditaely preceding the return of Christ, God will bring plagues, pestilences, and great destruction upon them. Regardless of all this men will not repent of their evil deeds or cry out to God for mercy, but they will blaspheme and curse God.

Revelation 16:9

And men were scorched with great heat, and blasphemed the name of God, which hath power over these plagues: and they repented not to give him glory.

Even at the very end men do not change their attitude toward God because they will become thoroughly reprobate. Many men who have lived exceedingly wicked lives will pray and cry out to the Lord for mercy when they are on their death bed, when they know that there is no other possible hope for them. But, these men who will witness the coming of the Lord will be far more calloused hearted and reprobate than men are now. They will ask for death and pray to the mountain to hide them before they will call on ehe name of the Lord.

Revelation 6:16, 17

And said to the mountains and rocks, Fall on us, and hide us from the face of him that sitteth on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb:

For the great day of his wrath is come;

and who shall be able to stand?

How could be describe the mental condition of men at this time other than spiritual psychosis or blindness? Men will no longer be capable to realizing the reality of God or His plan of mercy. Humanity's mind will become so reprobate that they will be beyond any possible recovery.

God's plan for the ages has been unfolding as a play that proceeds from one act to another. Now the stage is set for the final scene. Some of the actors have been chosen and are being prepared and rehearsed for their parts. Those that would listen have been told these things before hand so that they might be standing in the right place when the final curtain comes down instead of being caught in the snare of deception.
