From The Pastor...

Be very careful then, how you live-not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity. Ephesians 5: 15

I reflect upon the program year that we have just left. We've lost loved ones. We've gained new members. We've Baptized. We've endured the wildest winter in memory together. We've worshiped and prayed together. We've added caring ministries- Stephan Ministries, support group, ministry of caring. We've grown in spirit and faith.

The question is, 'Where do we go next?' I know some rather intense discussions are underway on how to have another successful youth ministry year and growing the Sunday school, while also having a successful Confirmation class. That'll be a challenge. Also, we will be opening the O & A discussion and building compliance with the Safe Church Policy.

I have some other ideas that I'd like you to think and pray about this summer that I'd like to get your feedback on. As you know, I spent a week out of the office last month in a program called BAP (Building Abrahamic Partnerships) at the Hartford Seminary. It is the three religions that trace our origins back to Abraham (if you want to read up on that, start at Genesis 12), Christianity, Judaism, and Islam. It was an extraordinary week of learning about each other's faiths and interfaith conversation. All I'll say here is that these three faiths that have been in conflict more time than not spent the week realizing that we are much more alike than we are different.

Then we had the horrific hate crime, domestic terrorist attack, call it what you will, at Mother Emanuel AMC Church in Charleston, NC. For all the progress that we think we have made in race relations in our country, we see that racism and bigotry is still real and vicious.

The question is, 'What can we do?' Here is my thought. We do what I did at the Hartford Seminary. We sit with people that are different from us. We open our hearts and minds to Jews, Muslims, African-Americans, Latinos, whoever is willing to talk to us. We learn, we grow, we pray, we talk, we listen, and we love. We are called by Jesus to love our enemies. Governments, our government, will not find the way out of our conflicts. It is people of good will working together to find a way.

One more thing... As Pastor, I walk a fine line. I am called to lead and to serve. As leader, I'd like us in the coming program year to open interfaith and inter-race dialogs. But, you may or may not be interested in that. I want to be the best pastor I can be for you. I need to hear where you are on this idea so we can move forward together in Christ.

### Safe Church Update



### **Finance**

Reminder: UCC Fellowship Dues are \$19.10 per person.

To support our 2015 budget we need an average weekly envelope offering of \$1,880 and an average miscellaneous income of \$774 for a total of \$2,654.

As of Sunday, June 28th, our average weekly envelope income was \$2,009 and our average weekly miscellaneous income was \$719 (\$2,728 total).

As all of you know during the summer months attendance always drops off here at Union Congregational Church (it would be great if it doesn't this year but in reality with vacations, cookouts etc. it will). We would like you to keep us in your mind even if you're not physically here. Our bills at the church don't stop (some might lower a little but they keep coming in). We build our budget on your pledges. If you pledge a certain amount per week or per month we rely on that throughout the year (even through the summer months or a week you're not here). Statements will be going out soon. We are asking that you take a look at these statements and if you have some "catching up" to do on your pledge please do so when you can. If you have any issues or questions with your statement please see Laurie Mitcheson, Howard Martin or a member of the Finance Committee and they can help you. If you cannot attend the Wednesday evening services you can mail in your envelopes to the church (105 Pleasant St, E. Bridgewater, MA 02333) or stop by during office hours.
