

U-47700

U-47700 is a synthetic opioid that is approximately 7.5 times more potent than morphine. It's duration of action is short, generally between 1 and 3 hours.

In 2016, U-47700 was responsible for a number of hospitalizations and at least two deaths in various part of the United States. It was sold through the Internet as a "research chemical" and is sometime found on the street as an adulterant in heroin. In 2016, the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) placed U-47700 in Schedule I of the Controlled Substance Act.
