This 'In Between' Time

Spring is a magical time of year. I never fully appreciated spring when we lived in San Diego because, quite honestly, it always felt like spring there. But after my first winter in Moline, as I saw the trees starting to produce their buds and realized there were green shoots coming up through the ground I felt an elation that I did not expect. Three years later, as the flowers start blooming and the trees begin to

flower and leaf up, I still stand in awe of their beauty. The joy spring brings me is a joy that is shared by so many during this time of year. But this year, spring feels especially important. That joy it brings today is felt more deeply than in previous years. The hope of new life it symbolizes accompanies me and helps to keep me moving forward as I am surrounded by news of this pandemic.

We have been living with our state's Stay at Home order for seven weeks, and its extension, although disappointing, is critically important for the health of our community. What an incredible seven weeks it has been. This pandemic has brought us into a new reality of physical distancing, Zoom meetings, live streamed worship, and a new understanding of the importance of hand washing. I never imagined something like this was possible and now that we are in it, I would like to be able to say that we know the date of the conclusion of all this. As we know too well though, that is not possible yet. I am confident that we will come out the other side of this pandemic a strong community but we will be much different coming out than we were going in. Rev. Cameron Trimble, a UCC minister, compares this time in our church history to that of a caterpillar transforming into a butterfly and offers this reflection:

We are mush right now. We are messy, fragile, unprotected, insecure, unrecognizable, disoriented, developing, transforming, imaginal beings. We are in that liminal space between what was and what can be. Our becoming something better on the other side of this is not guaranteed. But with the right conditions, with the awakening of people to the beauty of our planet and the intimacy of our connection to everyone and everything, we have the chance to become something new...If ever there was a moment for you to become who God has dreamed you to be, it's now. Don't miss the chance. Everything is being made new, especially you.

This is an historic time in our country and a time of huge possibilities for reimaging our future and how Hope UCC will grow into this new future. We have already made changes to ensure that Hope UCC's members and friends are staying connected. There are always ways we can improve, and your ideas and suggestions and feedback are very important in this process. Please continue to reach out to others to check in with them. But also, please let us know how you are doing or how we can better care for you in this time. We are in this together, and most importantly, we are held with love by God throughout it all. I have often said that the Holy Spirit guides us into places we wouldn't enter on our own. Well, here we are. She doesn't ditch us once we are there – Spirit stays with us, empowering us to stay strong and focused on how to live as God's people in this space and beyond.

I pray that you are all staying well and that you continue to feel God's Spirit holding you. I pray that you feel connected to your faith community at Hope UCC as we continue to live in this 'in

between time' – the time between what was before we ever heard the words 'Corona Virus' and what our community looks like after the stay at home order is lifted. Please be assured that through it all – Hope Grows! Let the words of Paul's letter to the Romans assure you of this truth: For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Hope UCC's Open and Affirming (ONA) Journey

Throughout the past two years, Hope UCC has had programs, meetings, discussions, and forums preparing us to become an official Open and Affirming (ONA) congregation of the United Church of Christ. Our congregational vote to affirm our ONA covenant was scheduled for April 26. Unfortunately, we were not able to meet in person for that vote and it will be many weeks until we are able to do so. Even then, we still may not all be in worship together due to the need to continue physical distancing by some of our members. Consequently, on April 23, our Church Council approved a motion to hold our vote to affirm our ONA covenant by a mail-in ballot. Hope UCC's Constitution, while not specifically mentioning a "vote by mail" process, does not exclude the ability to conduct business in this manner, especially under such historically unprecedented and extreme circumstances as the current "quarantine in place" due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Because of the importance of this issue, as well as the uncertainty as to when regular church services will resume, Hope's Church Council felt it was important to conduct this important business by a mail-in ballot.

The Open and Affirming Covenant, as presented at the 2020 Annual Meeting, is as follows:

Hope United Church of Christ invites and welcomes into our faith community persons of every ability, age, race, nationality, economic and social status, faith background, marital standing and family structure, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression. We commit ourselves to the ongoing work of being an ONA (Open and Affirming) congregation, one that lives out the belief that God is still speaking. With God's grace, we journey together in Christian faith.

Every member of Hope UCC will receive a ballot in the mail during the week of May 18th. On this ballot you will have three choices:

<u>Yes</u>– affirming our ONA covenant leading us to become and ONA congregation.

<u>No</u>- opposing the affirmation of our ONA covenant and opposing becoming an ONA congregation.

<u>Abstain</u>- you do not wish to vote in favor or against this issue.

A self-addressed, stamped return envelope will accompany your ballot. **Please return all ballots to Hope UCC's office no later than May 30**th.

As outlined by Hope UCC's Constitution, a quorum must equal fifty percent (50%) plus one individual of the average attendance for two (2) months prior to a congregational vote. In this case that average will be calculated from the attendance of January and February, since March 7th was the last Sunday when regular worship services were held at Hope UCC. Therefore, in order to properly conduct this business by mail at least a quorum of ballots must be returned to the church office no later than May

30th. We are grateful for your cooperation in ensuring this quorum is met.

If you have any questions feel free to contact any member of the ONA Committee. We hope that you will prayerfully consider your vote on this important matter in the life of Hope United Church of Christ.
