

- Side note: for those of you who might be thinking that John is the light sent from God, John's gospel wants you to know that he is not.


The light is Jesus, and people are about to get hit with that info—hard.

September Remembering

We are all aware that pain is real for each and everyone; and depending on the day we share in our own portion quite often, and at times pain seems to never cease. Where is God in all of this? Does God even care? If so, why doesn't God just stop pain from happening?

Then I remembered a verse from the First Gospel when Jesus wept over the Holy City. (Matthew 23:37) "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!" ... and I wonder how many, if any, of us would be willing to surrender our free will.

Or could this be the wrong question to be asking since very often our pain is caused by our own actions, or the actions of other human beings, and each one of us has free will. This was the case with the three terrorist incidents that took place back in 2001. At other times, pain is experienced simply because of the human condition; our bodies aren't made to last forever. As I think about it, does anything on earth last forever?

So, I returned to the original question that I asked. Does God hurt when humans hurt? Then the answer seemed to be obvious. If God doesn't, why would God have become one of us in the person of Jesus? Why would Jesus have lived his earthly life on such a meager scale simply to teach us the ways of God, and how God would have us live?
