Like I have stated, thank you, and I hope this might help motivate your spirits to help or maybe change your heart or your thoughts of not being able to help. Recently several of us from Chapel Hill UMC and First UMC gathered to discuss going on a Mission Trip to the Hurricane zone in Texas. This would be a trip by the Henderson County United Methodist Mission Team. This Team consist of folks from Cairo UMC, Belleview UMC (Smith Mills), Niagara UMC, Bennett Memorial UMC, First UMC and Chapel Hill UMC.

This Team has a few funds in our account to be seed money for the trip. It didn't take us long to realize that such

a trip would take two days travel (one night in a motel) going and coming. That would be 4 days that would not be productive for us, just scenic.

We have the talent and time to make repairs or do construction somewhere.....so where? Bud Hill of FUMC observed that the Kentucky Conference of the UMC had recently cut their budget drastically and were no longer

funding completely the United Methodist Church Camps in KY. He also stated that our Mission Team could get greater results by working as a team in KY. Actually helping our own folks!

Camp Loucon is the nearest Church camp to us, so let's consider that location. Leitchfield, KY and it's only 1.5 to 2 hours away plus their needs are great. We discussed this briefly and adjourned our meeting without any real answers. Within 3 days, Pastor Amy Call received an email from Warren Hopper, Director of Camp Loucon stating the needs that they have for construction help during the next few months. He sent a list of items with his email which was forwarded to us.

We are so excited Camp Loucon has need of help for many repairs and construction projects in the next few months. We have contacted Warren Hopper about going there on a Construction Mission Trip and helping to make repairs to the Camp both on the interior and exterior of

many of their buildings.

So, we would like to invite **YOU** to go along with us to Camp Loucon in early February for repairs and construction to their facility. We will be conducting a meeting soon after the 1st of the year in order to organize such an event. We will try to take a team of 10 to 12 members for 4 or 5 nights and days to help get Camp Loucon in shape for summer camps. If we

have more than this number, we will try to accommodate.
