WHY THE NEED TO KEEP FUNDING OUR RESERVE ACCOUNTS?

Westhollow Villa is fortunate to have enough in our accounts to be considered solvent community. However, the current total is not sufficient to meet all our needs in the event of a catastrophic fire or flood. It is important to continue to save to avoid levying a special assessment in such cases.

YEAR END UPDATES

- ✓ The 2019 Budget was discussed and approved at the September HOA Meeting.
- ✓ Monthly assessment fees will remain the same.
- ✓ The Board discussed current insurance coverage and upon the recommendation of our provider, agreed replacement cost should be increased to \$80 per square foot. The change will be reflected at the next renewal.
- ✓ All general maintenance programs (Building Painting, Patio Fence and Roof Replacement) met the set goals for the year.
- ✓ Concrete work around the property was planned for September and October had to be posted due to weather. Elevations were done in preparation. Work will begin with the driveway behind 13975-13981, as this area experiences drainage problems.

HOLIDAY COOKING – SAFETY FIRST

Across the country the number of kitchen fires reported is exponentially higher on holidays.

- Unattended cooking is the primary cause of kitchen fires. If you must leave the kitchen, turn the burner off.
- Use a moderate cooking temperature.
- Turn pot handles away from the front of the stove
- Don't position handles over another burner, it may catch on fire or burn someone who touches it.
- Wear short or tight fitting long sleeves when cooking to reduce a clothing fire hazard.
- Shield yourself from scalding steam when lifting lids from hot pans.
- Keep pot holders away from the burners.
- Ensure ovens, broilers, stove tops, and exhaust ducts free from grease.
- ❖ Always, have a working smoke detector!
- ❖ If a fire starts in the oven turn it off and keep the oven door closed.
- If you attempt to extinguish the fire, it is best to use a class ABC multipurpose fire extinguisher.
- ❖ When in doubt Call the Fire Department!
