

#### **Sunday Reflection: Third Sunday of Lent**

When Jesus went to Jerusalem at Passover time, he shocked the Jewish leaders by forcibly expelling the money-chargers and traders from the temple. Jesus referred to the temple as his Father's house which was being made into a "house of trade" (John 2:16) and "den of robbers" (Mark 11:17). Jesus' disciples recalled the prophetic words of Psalm 69: "Zeal for your house will consume me." This psalm was understood as a Messianic prophecy. Here the disciples saw Jesus more clearly as the Messiah who burned with zeal for God's house.

2 Chronicles 36:14-23 Ephesians 2:4-10 John 3:14-21

Jesus' cleansing of the temple is also a prophetic sign of what he wants to do with each of us. He ever seeks to cleanse us of our sinful ways in order to make us into living temples of his Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19). God desires that we be holy as he is holy. Do we recognize the indwelling presence of God within us through the gift and working of his Holy Spirit? The Lord Jesus wants to renew our minds and to purify our hearts so that we may offer God fitting worship and enjoy his presence both now and forever. Ask the Lord Jesus to fill us with a holy desire and burning zeal for his holiness and glory to grow in us and transform the way we think, act, and live as a son or daughter of God. Let us pray: Lord Jesus Christ, you open wide the door of your Father's house and you bid us to enter confidently that we may worship in spirit and truth. Help us to draw near to your throne of mercy with gratitude and joy.

### Saint of the Week ... St. Frances of Rome

Born of wealthy parents, Frances felt a calling to religious life early in her youth, but her parents objected and a young nobleman was selected to be her husband. As she became acquainted with his family, Frances discovered that the wife of her husband's brother also wished to live a life of service and prayer. So the two, Frances and Vannozza, set out together with their husbands' blessings to help the poor.

Frances fell ill for a time, but this apparently only deepened her commitment to the suffering people she met. The years passed, and Frances gave birth to two sons and a daughter. With the new responsibilities of family life, the young mother turned her attention more to the needs of her own household.

The family flourished under Frances' care, but within a few years a great plague began to sweep across Italy. It struck Rome with devastating cruelty and left Frances' second son dead. In an effort to help alleviate some of the suffering, Frances used all her money and sold her possessions to buy whatever the sick might possibly need. When her resources had been exhausted, she went door to door begging. Later, Frances' daughter died, and she then opened a section of her house as a hospital.


Frances became more convinced that this way of life was necessary for the world, and soon was given permission to organize a society of women bound by no vows. They simply offered themselves to God and to the service of the poor. Once the society was established, Frances chose not to live at the community residence, but rather at home with her husband. She did this until her husband passed away, and then came to live the remainder of her life with the society, serving the poorest of the poor.

In 1925 Pope Pius XI declared Frances the patron saint of automobiles because of a leged that an angel used to light the road before her with a lantern, keeping Frances safe from harm.


#### **Diocesan Collection This Weekend**
