EVENTS LEADING UP TO THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN SAINT GEORGE

Part I

The Catholic era in Utah dates back to September 1776, when two Franciscan Fathers passed through this part of the country preaching Christianity to the indigenous people of Utah Valley. They were among the very first group of non-Native Americans to enter this vast untamed land. When they arrived, Utah was then a part of Mexico, thus possessed by Catholic Spain. In October of that same year, the Franciscans headed south establishing a camp near Utah Lake and continued their religious teaching. They also took time to travel to the southern reaches of Utah, later called "Dixie." For a long time, they had hoped to find a direct route between the missions in California and Santa Fe, but the great canyon of Colorado stood between them as an impassable barrier. Their efforts to open the trail of the west and their contributions to Utah's history are both colonial as well as religious. *(Continued in next week's bulletin).*

HOW QUOTAS FOR THE DIOCESAN DEVELOPMENT DRIVE (DDD) ARE SET

Over ten years ago DDD quotas were set based on how successful parishes were at meeting past quotas and an informal assessment of the financial outlook each parish faced during the coming DDD cycle. When parishes who were on the low end of the quotas began to grow, there was a battle over how much the DDD quota for these parishes should rise. Also, not all parishes that had been doing well financially in the past continued to do so.

About ten years ago the diocese began to use each parish's annual operating income (OI) from the previous year in setting quotas. Eventually it became clear that the fairest way to set quotas was based on operating income. However, some parishes with a small financial base eventually grew and some larger ones remained relatively the same.

In recent years a series of levels of operating parish income has been devised. A percentage of operating income is connected with each level, with parishes with less operating income paying a smaller percentage of their operating income and parishes with larger operating incomes paying a greater percentage. These levels and percentages are still being perfected, but our parish is clearly on the high end. Currently, our percentage is 17% of operating income or \$127,546.00.


THE CHOSEN
