June 16, 2019 Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity Jn 16:12-15

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Trinity Sunday! But not just today. Hang on, because we have a Trinity of Celebrations coming for the next couple of weekends! First, today is Trinity Sunday, then comes Corpus Christi, followed the next week with the Feast of the Sacred Heart. And we thought the celebrations ended with Easter and Pentecost! I love to say about us Catholics, that we are a 'celebration always about to start', or a 'party waiting to happen'! What I mean can be proven simply looking at any Catholic Calendar. We have Feast Days and Holy Days to celebrate nearly all the time. We call it the liturgical calendar and it is testimony to the rich history and full tradition of our heritage from the earliest Church days until now! For example, just consider the past week June 10-15: this one week we observed a special day Monday, called a Feast of Mary, under the title of 'Mother of the Church', on Tuesday we celebrated the life of St Barnabas, and on Thursday St Anthony of Padua. Some weeks are filled with nearly every weekday being dedicated to a celebratory memorial of some part of Jesus' life or the lives of any of His model-disciples! Sometimes it may seem like too much to take in! But that is why I love our Catholic Faith! There is always something to learn and something to be inspired by, to apply in our lives. And just think: We are all part of this! The Church's history is made each day. Our lives and today's events add to it. How do we appreciate it best? By our faithful practice and dedication to first knowing our faith and then actively sharing it! So today we get into it by tackling the primary teaching of our belief in God as a Holy Trinity! Yet, what a steep push to begin with? Try explaining the Mystery of God's Life as a Trinity of Persons. What a task! Have you ever been asked a deep question about your work or occupational field in an elevator or as you wait in line at the grocery? You want to help and offer a complete answer but where do you begin? I love my dentist and dental hygienist because we often talk about our Catholic Faith, but it is such a challenge for me because I am the one in the chair! Here's how it goes: We are just getting started on a routine cleaning, (my mouth full of accessories) and the question is popped? "Did the Pope really change the Our Father prayer?" Or "Is the Church caving in to pressure from China's Government over the selection of its Bishops?" A quick and short answer doesn't do the questions justice (but in case you are wondering about those two questions, both are answered 'No'). And almost always, some background information is needed to clarify and draw the fuller implications of events or topics inadequately introduced in the news. And those are just recent news items. What if I am asked by an atheist, "How do you know there is a God?" or maybe asked by a Muslim, "Why do you believe in three Gods?" Now we are talking! Suddenly the opportunity opens to introduce our Christian teaching on the Trinity.

I heard once that attempting to define God's Being is like trying to nail a block of Jello to the wall! I like to start with the bible story of Jacob wrestling with the angelic being in Genesis 32:25-31. Jacob's all-night struggle results in him suffering a chronic injury and taking on a new name. Greatest of all, Jacob knew He came face-to-face with God and lived to tell about it. A key detail important for our thinking on the Trinity is that Jacob had *asked the name of his divine challenger*, as if demanding of God, "Explain yourself to me-Who are you?" He is not given a name, but is blessed by his divine visitor. Jacob wants to explain-fully and define God (pin God down), but he cannot. So struggle as we might, too, explaining God, we will not be able to exhaust the depth of God's life and mystery. But, we must try, because the quest-ioning is what gives us our own name and blessing (Gen 32:30).

Some traditional images or teaching illustrations include, St Patrick's shamrock (3 leaves, yet 1 plant), or an egg with its shell, yolk and white, or an apple with its rind skin, seeds and inner flesh, or water in three states of liquid, solid and gas, or even geometric designs like a triangle of three lines and M.C. Escher's design of trefoil knots. St Augustine and St Thomas saw a glimpse of God's essence from the created 'image of God within us' in the human abilities to love and think. The Trinity was reflected in the relations taken up in thinking (between mind, thought and word), or in loving (between a lover, a beloved and the actual love shared). Or we can simply go to God Himself and hear Jesus teach about the Trinity in Matthew 28:19 saying, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" or in John 14:16-17 where Jesus tells us, I (Son) will ask the Father, and He will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever, the Spirit of truth..." Yet, in the end, as with all mysteries, God's life comes down to being best known, when simply experienced, not explained. One to pray about this week!
