Registration for Children Not Currently Enrolled in BHPCNS:




October is the time to submit an application for the 2017-2018 school year for siblings of currently enrolled children. Applications are available in the office and online now for children who will be starting BHPCNS in September 2016. Registration for currently enrolled students will begin in December. Acceptance or Wait List notifications will be sent home in late January. Applications are available on the BHPCNS website at www.bhpcns.org

Friends, And Neighbors:

Encourage your friends and neighbors to call the office to learn more about BHPCNS and to schedule a tour of our school. New families say they chose Bradley Hills because their friend, neighbor, co-worker, spoke highly of our program. We love that you love us! Help us spread the word about what a wonderful place BHCPNS is for all children to play, grow, and learn! Spots fill up quickly. The sooner we receive an application the more likely we will be able to offer a new family a place next year.

Registration for Current BHPCNS Students:

Registration for **children currently enrolled at BHPCNS** will be December 10 and 11. Applications will be available on the BHPCNS website at www.bhpcns.org, after Thanksgiving. Download and complete the application. Applications should be returned to BHPCNS no earlier than December 10 and no later than December 11 in order to be given priority in enrollment. Please recognize that children currently enrolled in our 2s and 3s program as well as those children who are enrolled in the 4s program but are not age eligible for Kindergarten, are guaranteed a place, but, it may not be your first choice. Acceptance is based on a first-come, first-serve basis. Families will be notified in late January as to their child's placement for the 2017-2018 school

Tuition Payments:

Payments are due the first of each month, Sept.-May, and are considered late if not receive by the 15th of the month. If your payment is not received by the 15th, a 10% late fee will be assessed. If you have set up an automated "bill payer" system, please be sure the words Nursery School appear on the check to make sure your payment is received at the Nursery School and not deposited with the Church's donations by mistake.

Student Absences:

If your child is ill and will be missing school, please call the office, or send us an email. If your child has a communicable disease strep throat, head lice, etc. we need to know to be able to share that information with the rest of your child's class. We will never identify your child or family but we are obligated to share communicable disease information with the other families.

Student Records:

We are doing a thorough check of all our student's records. We will notify you of any missing paperwork, immunizations, etc. We ask that you submit any missing paperwork promptly. We appreciate your help in making sure our records are compliant with state regulations.

School Directory:

The school directory will be coming home in October. The Directory is a great way to connect with other parents and children at BHPCNS.

Donations:

Before you throw it out donate it to BHPCNS.

- Large oatmeal canisters to be crafted into drums.
- We participate in the Ronald McDonald House Pop Tab Recycling Program. Pull off those tabs from your soda cans, cat food cans, and other cans that have one. When you've got a bunch, bring them to school and we will send them off!
- BHPCNS also collects used ink cartridges. Drop yours by the office.

Children's Lunches:

BHPCNS provides organic 1% milk at lunch each day. Children are offered a choice of milk or water at lunch time. You do not need to pack a drink with your child's lunch.

Please pack healthy, nutritious lunches for your children. BHPCNS teachers are not allowed by our licensing agency to make the children eat their "growing" foods first. If you pack a cookie and your child wants to eat that instead of their sandwich, we are technically not allowed to have them eat their sandwich first.

We will send home any easily wrapped, uneaten lunch foods. Uneaten yogurts, apple sauce cups, etc. will be tossed. Lunch is a social time. Children like to talk and share their lives at lunch. Sometimes this gets in the way of eating their whole lunch. Many children choose to finish their lunches in their car on the way home.

Lunch Bags:

Soft sided, small lunch bags without freezer packs and bento boxes are perfect for our refrigerators. Large, rigid, lunch boxes and containers are not acceptable for school. Questions? Pop into the office.


BHPCNS Open Door Policy:

If at any time during the school year, you have a concern, complaint, an idea, or suggestions, please email, text, come to the office, or call us. We truly want to know your thoughts. Your ideas, suggestions, and critiques provide us with vital information that we can use to improve our programming. No issue is too small. If you have a concern at any time, please bring it to our attention.

Parent Bulletin Board:

Located by the bathrooms is a parents' bulletin board. We post information about parenting classes, upcoming special events, programming for children announcements and the like on our bulletin board. Check it out.

CARPOOL UPDATES



In an effort to make carpool run smoothly, quickly, and fair for everyone we need you to follow these protocols:

- 1. Caregivers who walk to the doorways, please leave space for us to walk children to their cars.
- 2. You **MUST REMAIN IN YOUR CAR**. We will bring your child to the car. At that time, you may exit the car to buckle your child into their car seat.
- 3. Carpool is not the time to have a conversation with your child's teacher. If you have an issue you wish to discuss, please call the school or email the teacher to chat.
- 4. **FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY:** Wait patiently for the cars in front of you to pull away from the school before pulling forward. **DO NOT** reverse your car to get out of the line while there are children being placed in cars in front of you. The only time you should go around a car in front of you is when directed to do so by a staff member.

The goal of carpool is to get children to their cars as quickly as possible. Adhering to our policies makes that possible. Thank you for sharing this information with anyone who will be collecting your child in the carpool line. If we all work together the carpool line will move much quicker.

CONSULTANTS AT BHPCNS

Throughout the school year there will be consultants working with BHPCNS staff and students. The consultants working with the children and staff may include, para educators, speech pathologists, occupational specialists, physical therapists, interns exploring the early childhood education field, social and emotional development specialists, overall best practice in child development mentors, and such. These specialists could be from the Montgomery County Public School system, Montgomery County Social Services, or private practices. It's possible your child will come home and share that there was an extra "teacher" in their classroom. These "extra" teachers will all be approved by the office prior to working in our school. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns.

SPEECH SCREENINGS OCTOBER 10 AND NOVEMBER 10



On October 10th and November 10th, BHPCNS will have a speech pathologist at school to screen children for speech issues. It is a brief screening and not an assessment. Teachers will recommend children to be screened. The office will send you a letter telling you that your child has been referred to be screened. You may opt out of the screening by returning the form to school. Parents may also request a speech screening. Please notify the office or your child's teacher if you'd like you child screened.



The children are so proud of their cooking skills.






Tuesday & Wednesday: Dance Company

In October, Miss Chelsea will continue introducing dance vocabulary such as the names of positions and basic dance steps for example: Bourre' and Chase'. The children are working with long ribbon sticks as they expand their range of motion while learning the structure of dance class. We will be playing with the theme of animals and how they might hop, stretch, spin, move slowly and heavily or quickly and lightly. Each of the movements learned, will lead up to our combinations for the December Recital.

We are learning about directions, continents, maps and the globe. During this year, we will be "visiting" at least one country from every continent, 10 countries in all. We will create a passport for our travels and add a sheet for each country that we visit. We will be visiting; United States, Perú, Italy, Zimbabwe, Antarctica, Greece, Australia, Japan, Poland and Cuba. If you have special knowledge of one of these country and want to share with us, please let us know!! In October we will be leaving the United States and learning about our first country Perú. We are very excited to learn about our neighbors to the South! ¡Buen Viaje!

Fun Fridays: On Fun Fridays in October, we will be exploring farms! We will learn about some of the things we get from farms, including milk, wool, and delicious fruits and vegetables. The children will all work together to create a barn out of cardboard. We will learn about cows, and make our own butter from heavy cream. We will read about sheep, and learn how to make felted wool. We will end the month by talking about pumpkins and painting a pumpkin to take home!

Music Mr. Chip For 2s, 3s, & 4s

Mr. Chip Reports: Fall is here and it is time to sing and dance and play in music with Mr. Chip! This fall our focus will be on cooking, food, and the kitchen in general. In addition to mixing up some alligator stew (which is particularly tasty after the children have come up with ingredients to add), we will make music using bowls, spoons, and other kitchen items. While making the stew, we will explore smooth and bumpy (legato and staccato) motions as we wash and chop the ingredients, and after eating it all up we will of course explore many ways to move. Through the use of the song "Rig a Jig Jig," we will practice moving in duple (walking, marching, etc) and triple (skipping, galloping, etc.) meters. I am looking forward to another wonderful year of making music at Bradley Hills.

Mrs. Sutherland Shares: The falling leaves of Autumn will take center stage this month in Science as we explore the life of trees. How do they grow? What do they eat? Why do their leaves change color? And, what is a tree ring??? We will be answering these questions and more, as well as learning about the many wonderful things that trees provide us and our animal friends.
