



Winter and Road Construction

The old joke goes, "There are two seasons in Minnesota, winter and road construction". Both "seasons" were touched on at the September 12th Two Harbors City Council meeting with much of the focus being on recent road improvement work that has been taking place over the summer.

Residents of Two Harbors have been living

with street improvement projects for the past year or more. Folks who live on 4th, 5th and 6th Avenues and 7th and 8th Streets have been receiving new blacktop pavement and new concrete curbing in their neighborhoods. Sidewalks are also being replaced on most of these streets as are storm sewers, water mains and sanitary sewer lines. This work, while inconvenient, is bringing necessary infrastructure improvements to the city and quality of life improvements to its residents. A Street Improvement Project hearing for 2023-24 is scheduled for October 10 at 6:00 pm at City Hall.

The Two Harbors Public Library has also

been getting some needed maintenance this

summer. Waterproof tiles have been installed

to mitigate the problem of water leaking into

the historic building. That work has been completed and the Library is back to offering a full pallet of activities for the Fall. The folks who participated in the Read Beyond the Beaten Path program logged over 333,000 minutes of reading over the course of the summer.

Upcoming meetings of the City Council are posted on the Two Harbors City Government web page: www.twoharborsmn.gov. A budget presentation is scheduled for Thursday, September 22nd at City Hall.

Acting Mayor Ben Redden closed the meeting by reading a proclamation declaring September, Suicide Awareness Month.
