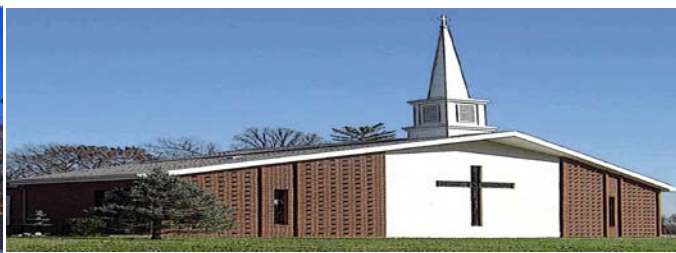

John 6:60-69

Jesus then said to the Twelve, “Do you also want to leave?”

Jesus attempted several times to explain to the people who were following him that they must become like him, to consume him, to imitate him, and many drifted away from him. He understood that many would find that difficult to accept and would reject him. The Twelve may not have understood what Jesus was saying, but they stayed with him. Jesus gives them a chance to express their belief in him, and ask, “Do you also want to leave?” Simon Peter responds with a declaration of Faith, “Master, to whom shall we go?” There are many mysteries we Catholics believe are true. Through the use of Reason, assisted by Revelation and Tradition, we accept on Faith the existence of a Triune God, the Divinity and Humanity of Jesus, the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, Eternal Life for those who consume and imitate Jesus, and more. Jesus knows that the world in which we live constantly challenges our Faith and he is asking us, “Do you want to leave?” Do we leave or do we respond, “Master, to whom shall we go?”
