"I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:5

Dear Folks.

This Bible verse comes from the Gospel Lesson from the 5th Sunday of Easter. In using the image of the vine and the branches, Jesus emphasizes to his disciples the need to be connected to him and in turn, connected to God. They cannot bear the fruit of ministry if they are not grounded in unity with Jesus, the vine.

As Christians we proclaim this unity every time we gather and celebrate our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Our connection to Jesus is strengthen when we gather to worship, to learn, to volunteer and serve others, to be in fellowship with each other.
